## **19 Year Old Anson High School Student Dead After Shooting, Car Accident**

On Friday, March 17 deputies with the Anson County Sheriff's Office responded to an area on Airport Road in Wadesboro in reference to a traffic accident. During the initial investigation it was determined that the victim, Tony Ahmad Gainey, 19, of Wadesboro, suffered an apparent gunshot wound.

Investigators responded and secured the scene. The investigation is ongoing. The Sheriff's Office is being assisted by State Bureau of Investigation and the North Carolina Highway Patrol.

Detectives encourage anyone with information to come forward by contacting the Anson County Sheriff's Office at 704-694-4188.

Anson County Sheriff Scott Howell said, "More details will be released as the investigation unfolds. Thank you for your patience.'

## **Anson County's January Unemployment Rate**

Anson County Anson County's unemployment rate for January was 4.3%. Anson County ranked #71 among the 100 counties statewide (low to high).

Here are other past rates in Anson County: 2022: December 4.0%; November 4.6%; October 4.9%; September 4.2%; August 4.9%; July 4.7%; June 5.3%; May 4.7%; April 4.6%; March 4.9%; February 5.1%; January 5.1%. **2021**: December 4.4%; November 4.7%; October 5.2%; September 4.9%; August 5.8%; July 6.5%; June 6.1%; May 5.5%; April 5.4%; March 5.9%; February 7.5%; January 7.7%. The **2020** rates were: December 7.1%; November 7.2%; October 7.2%; September 8.5%; August 8%; July 10%; June 7.9%; May 10.1%; and April 8.2%.

In March 2020 the unemployment rate in Anson County was 4.9%, just before it was affected by the pandemic.

Statewide Statewide the unemployment rate for January was 3.7%

Anson's total labor force in January was 10,280, with 9,841 employed and 439 unemployed. In December the total labor force was 10,069, with 9,666 employed and 403 unemployed.

Unemployment rates (not seasonally adjusted) increased in 99 of North Carolina's counties in January 2023 and decreased in one. Hyde County had the highest unemployment rate at 10.1 percent while Greene, Buncombe, and Orange Counties each had the lowest at 3.0 percent.

All fifteen of the state's metro areas experienced rate increases. Among the metro areas, Rocky Mount had the highest rate at 5.4 percent while Asheville and Raleigh each had the lowest at 3.1 percent. The January not seasonally adjusted statewide rate was 3.7 percent.

When compared to the same month last year, not seasonally adjusted unemployment rates decreased in 71 counties, increased in 14, and remained unchanged in 15. Eleven of the state's metro areas experienced rate

### **Kindergarten Registration**

### **Registration meetings begin March 24**

Pre-Kindergarten registration will be held at the elementary school located in the attendance area where the child lives. Please check the dates and times below for the school your child will be attending.

To attend Kindergarten, your child has to be 5 on or before August 31, 2023. North Carolina Law requires a certified birth certificate - hospital/mother's copy birth certificates will not be accepted.

Prior to the Pre-Kindergarten registration clinics, forms can be picked up at the elementary school or on the Anson County Schools website under the Parent Portal button, ansonschools.org.

Anson County also requires at least 2 proofs of residence (911 address on Driver's License, address on a bill, etc.) to place the child in the proper attendance area. We encourage you to bring your child with you to the registration clinic!

#### Do not forget to bring these items: 1. Certified Birth Certificate for your child

2. Shot Record

- 3. Health Assessment (if already completed)
- 4. At least two (2) proofs of residence showing your 911 address

Additionally, beginning with the 2022-2023 school year, the Anson County Board of Education approved school choice for Kindergarten only (Policy 4150). Families are allowed to choose which elementary school their child attends. If you decide to send your child to a school outside of their attendance area, transportation will be the responsibility of the parent/guardian.

Anson County Schools looks forward to seeing you as you register your child for Pre-Kindergarten. If you have questions, please call the school in your attendance area and speak to the school nurse.

## **Roundabout Construction** Starting Next Week on Highway 218

N.C. Department of Transportation contract crews will start building a roundabout next week at the intersection of N.C. 200 and N.C. 218 in Union County, requiring the intersection to be closed to traffic after rush hour Monday morning.

During construction, non-truck traffic will follow a posted detour along Love Mill Road, Zebulon Williams Road and Haigler Gin Road and Honey Bee Road. Trucks will follow a separate detour from N.C. 24/27 to U.S. 601, U.S. 74, and N.C. 200, returning to N.C. 24/27. The intersection is scheduled to open in early June.

Roundabouts improve safety for drivers, pedestrians, and bicyclists. They also help reduce the congestion and backups more typical at traditional intersections with stop signs and traffic signals.

## **NCDOT HBCU Internship**, Fellowship **Programs Application Deadline Extended**

The N.C. Department of Transportation has extended the application deadline for the 2023 Historically Black Colleges and Universities internship and fellowship programs. The deadline to apply for an HBCU internship or fellowship is now March 31. The previous deadline to apply for the internship and fellowship was last week. Selected applicants will start work May 30.

NCDOT's HBCU and Minority-Serving Institution Internship Program provides hands-on experience for students attending HBCUs and MSIs. The summer internship program is an ideal way for undergraduate students to gain work experience with the NCDOT, while learning what a career in the transportation industry can offer. The internships also include professional development workshops on skills such as résumé building, business writing and networking.

Fellows are offered a two-year individual fellowship experience tailored to their interests, involvement and goals. Applicants who apply to the fellows program must have graduated within the past three years with a bachelor's degree or master's degree from a North Carolina HBCU or MSI.

Participants work in all areas of the transportation industry. The programs also offer free trainings and certifications, travel and opportunities to network with and learn from transportation professionals.

The fellowship program helps develop a pool of qualified employees for potential permanent positions within NCDOT and the transportation industry.
