Carolinas Writers Conference is Saturday

The Anson County Writer's Club is sponsoring the 8th Annual Carolinas Writers Conference this Saturday, April 16, from 8:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. at the Lockhart-Taylor Center in Wadesboro. Among the guest speakers are North Carolina Poet Laureate Shelby Stephenson, Michelle Buckman, Amy Clipston, Karen MacMurray, Robert Macomber, Kay McSpadden, Chris Roerden and Terry Roueche.

North Carolina Poet Laureate, Shelby Stephenson, will be the featured presenter at the eighth annual Carolinas Writers Conference, to be held at the Lockhart-Taylor Center in Wadesboro on April 16. Cost is \$30 and includes a catered lunch. Coordinated by the Anson County Writers' Club (ACWC), the conference offers one- and two-hour workshops to help beginning and published authors sharpen their craft tools. Readers will have the opportunity to meet authors and share the behind-the-scenes process from inspiration to printed page. Registration begins at 8:30 a.m.

Stephenson was a professor of English and editor of Pembroke Magazine until his retirement in 2010. He was presented with the North Carolina Award in Literature in 2001, and is the author of many books of poetry based on his childhood in Benson where he grew up on a small farm. He will entertain during the lunch break with "Poetry and Perhaps a Song," and lead a discussion in an afternoon session. Participants are asked to bring a sample of their own work to share.

Leading the morning workshops are: Robert Macomber, national award-winner for historical literary fiction, "Planning Your Writing Career: Organizing and Starting Your Literary Work;"; Kay McSpadden, novelist and newspaper columnist, "Tell All the Truth, But Tell it Slant: The Art of the Short Story;" Chris Roerden, publishing industry veteran, "What Editors Look For;" Terry Roueche, author of some 50 plays produced nationally and internationally, "Playwriting Workshop;" Amy Clipston, best-selling author of Amish fiction, "Keeping Up with Deadlines;" and Karen MacMurray, librarian, author, and internet marketing guru, "Social Media Made Easy.

Afternoon workshop presenters, in addition to Stephenson, are: Roerden, "Don't Murder Your Manuscript;" Mc-Spadden, "The Truth and Nothing but the Truth - Sort Of: Writing Effective Essays;" Macomber, "Marketing Yourself and Your Work: The How-to on Spreading the Word with a Limited Budget;" and Michelle Buckman, international conference speaker and author of six novels, "Plot and Character Layering."

Following the workshops, all presenters will join in a panel discussion to answer questions from attendees.


"We are trying to make this an "Everything Vietnam" experience from start to finish,"
