AMS Held Its Second Annual Science Fair

In January 2016 Anson Middle School hosted its second annual Science Fair. Open to all seventh grade students, the fair has been designed to allow students to apply what they have learned and create a hands-on project that reflects a science topic of their choice. Students had nearly six weeks to conduct research, design and implement an experiment and create a tri-fold display outlining their individualized project steps, data and results. Students had the opportunity to choose a topic within seventh grade science curriculum that included physical science, life science, earth science and technology.

Individualized projects were on display at the middle school for nearly two weeks and were judged by panel of teachers. Projects were evaluated on specific criteria that focused upon students' creativity, original thought, implementation of the scientific method, and overall presentation and analytical interpretation of data. Winners were then notified and ribbons were issued.

In the category of physical science Ethan Currie received First Place. Malerie Austin came in Second and Meredith Preslar was awarded Third Place. Honorable Mention was given to Drew Thomas.

Sean Hersey, Jayden Baucom and Mekhi Brooks were awarded First, Second and Third Place respectively in the category of Life Science. Kennedy Jones was awarded Honorable Mention.
