Anson County's Unemployment Rate Was 6.3% in February

Anson County's unemployment rate for February was 6.3 percent. In January the rate was 6.5 percent. Statewide he unemployment rate for February was 5.7 percent.

Anson's total labor force in February was 10,951. Of that number 10,266 were employed and 685 were unemployed. In January the total labor force was 10,908, with 10,196 employed and 712 unemployed.

Unemployment rates (not seasonally adjusted) decreased in 89 of North Carolina's counties in February, increased in five, and remained unchanged in six.

Graham County and Hyde County both had the highest unemployment rate at 14.2 percent while Orange County had the lowest at 4.2 percent. All 15 of the state's metro areas experienced rate decreases. Among the Metro areas, Rocky Mount at 8.1 percent experienced the highest rate and Asheville and Raleigh both had the lowest rate at 4.6 percent. The February not seasonally adjusted statewide rate was 5.7 percent.

When compared to the same month last year, not seasonally adjusted unemployment rates decreased in 95 counties and increased in five. All 15 metro areas experienced rate decreases over the year.

The number of workers employed statewide (not seasonally adjusted) increased in February by 47,142 to 4,412,037, while those unemployed decreased 6,783 to 264,689. Since February 2014, the number of workers employed statewide increased 98,117, while those unemployed decreased 54,895.
