On Saturday, April 28, Bernard Henry will be inducted into the Edinboro University's Athletic Hall of Fame class of 2012. Edinboro University is located in Northwestern Pennsylvania. Each year the University selects two athletes to represent male and female sports, and this is the year Bernard Henry has been Bernard had some outstanding accomplishments during his athletic career, many of which were accumulated right here on the football fields of Anson County.

While attending Edinboro University Henry was the sixth all-time rusher with 2,100 yards. In 1999 he was fourteenth with 1,046 yards, in 2000 he was thirteenth with 1,054 yards. Henry had ten games with over 100 rushing yards. Henry was a 2-time first team All PSAC, and in 2001 he was selected to The Cactus Bowl Team.

Henry said, "This is a very special time for me and I could not have made it this far without the grace of God and my family and friends. The road was tough and at times I felt like giving up, but my fellow Ansonians were the reason I continued to strive to make a difference. I would like to thank each and every one for the support and love they have shown me. The small things in life make a difference and this has certainly made a difference in mine.

Henry is a native of Anson County and is married to Allison Covington Henry. They have three children. He is the son of Robert and Willie Mae Henry of Wadesboro. He also has two brothers, Lamont and Willis Henry, and one sister, Gloria Campbell. He is the son-in-law of Marie Covington of Lilesville and Gary Covington of Wadesboro.

## THE AMENDMENT

HARMS FAMILIES

The poorly written amendment goes too far.

Marriage for gay and lesbian couples is already banned in our state. But the impact of the amendment is so broad that it snares not only gay and lesbian couples and their children in its legal net, but also any unmarried couple and their children.

Amendment One would interfere with protections for unmarried couples to visit one another in the hospital and to make emergency medical and financial decisions if one partner is incapacitated.

#### THE AMENDMENT **HARMS** UNMARRIED

WOMEN

It could take away domestic violence protections for all unmarried women.

The amendment is a dangerous step backward for domestic violence and stalking protection.

Domestic violence protections could only apply to married couples

In Ohio, where a similar amendment passed, this loophole has allowed convictions to be overturned.

### THE AMENDMENT **HARMS UNMARRIED**

**SENIORS** 

Seniors shouldn't have to choose between legal protections and the pensions they need to live.

A single or widowed senior couple could be forced to marry to keep their legal protections, which would cause them to lose benefits such as pensions, health care, and social security.
