Anson Veterans Receive Over \$19.5 Million in Benefits in 2022

The National Center for Veterans Analysis and Statistics has released their annual information about veterans and veteran benefits, called the Geographic Distribution of VA Expenditures (GDX).

Each Fiscal Year, the Department of Veterans Affairs' (VA's) Office of Enterprise Integration publishes the Geographic Distribution of VA Expenditures (GDX) report. This report provides the estimated dollar expenditures for major VA programs at the state, county, and Congressional District levels. Expenditure data are grouped by the following categories: Compensation and Pension, Education and Vocational Rehabilitation and Employment, Insurance and Indemnities, Construction, General Operating Expenses, Loan Guaranty, and Medical Care. Veteran population estimates at the state, county and Congressional District level and the number of unique patients who used VA healthcare services are also included in the report.

The GDX chart shows the work of the Anson County Veteran Services Office through federal dollars coming into Anson County, by way of earned VA benefits. In 2022 the Veteran Services Office assisted Anson County veterans in applying for and receiving over \$19,514,000 federal dollars, which is a 1-year increase of \$3,210,000 - the largest increase in federal dollars coming into Anson County ever. Anson County VA Officer Andrea Lamonds said, "I'm very proud of the work being accomplished for our

veterans who are so very deserving of these benefits. According to the 2022 GDX Anson County has 1,452 veterans. Here is how the \$19,514,000 federal dollars in Anson County was distributed:

- \$11,257,000 Compensation & pension
- \$163,000 Education & vocational rehabilitation/employment
- \$32,000 Insurance & indemnities
- \$8,063,000 Medical care
- \$498,000 Unique patients. (Patients who received reatment at a VA health care facility.)

Statewide, North Carolina has 687,364 veterans. They received \$11,187,658,000 in federal dollars for VA benefits. Here is how those funds were distributed:

- \$6,749,660,000 Compensation & pension
- \$19,161,000 Construction
- \$443,523,000 Education & vocational rehabilitation and employment
- \$91,086,000 General operating expenses
- \$30,261,000 Insurance & indemnities
- \$3,853,967 Medical care \$258,645,000 Unique patients.

September 7%; August 6.8%; July 8.9%. Anson's total labor force in March was 10,424, with 10,015 employed and 409 unemployed. In February the total labor force was 10,289, with 9,877 employed

and 412 unemployed.

Unemployment rates (not seasonally adjusted) decreased in 61 of North Carolina's counties in March 2023, increased in 12, and remained unchanged in 27. Hyde County had the highest unemployment rate at 8.8 percent while Buncombe County had the lowest at 2.8 percent.

Eight of the state's metro areas experienced rate decreases, two increased, and five remained unchanged. Among the metro areas, Rocky Mount had the highest rate at 5.2 percent while Asheville had the lowest at 2.9%. The March not seasonally adjusted statewide rate was 3.5%.

When compared to the same month last year, not seasonally adjusted unemployment rates increased in 49 counties, decreased in 30, and remained unchanged in Eleven of the state's metro areas experienced rate increases over the year and four remained unchanged.

The number of workers employed statewide (not seasonally adjusted) increased in March by 63,142 to 5,042,647, while those unemployed increased by 41 to 185,569. Since March 2022, the number of workers employed statewide increased 47,119, while those unemployed increased 7,055.

It is important to note that employment estimates are subject to large seasonal patterns; therefore, it is advisable to focus on over-the-year changes in the not seasonally adjusted estimates.

An investigation was started, and based on eyewitness statements, a suspect was identified. Hayward Wayne Freeman was identified as the shooter. Freemen was interviewed and arrested later that night.

Freeman was charged with Assault with a Deadly Weapon Intent to Kill Inflicting Serious Injury and placed in the Anson County Jail under a \$100,000.00 secured bond.
