### Governor Offers \$5,000 Reward for Information on Anson County Murder and Attempted Murder

On Wednesday, May 4 Governor Roy Cooper announced that the State is offering a reward of up to \$5,000 for information leading to the arrest and conviction of the person or persons responsible for the 2020 murder of

Maliki Byrd, age 16, and the attempted murder of Chrishaun Hough, age 15 at the time of the incident. On January 20, 2020, at approximately 5:30 p.m. the Wadesboro Police Department responded to a shooting in the roadway in front of 603 Oak Lane in Wadesboro.. Upon arrival officers discovered a vehicle riddled with bullets. Byrd was pronounced dead at the scene and Hough was critically injured. Hough survived the shooting,

#### Temporary Closure on Monroe Expressway This Weekend

The westbound entrance to the Monroe Expressway is scheduled for an overnight twelve-hour closure. Beginning at 9:00 p.m. on Friday, May 6 crews will detour all westbound traffic to replace a mainline bridge joint. All lanes are expected to re-open to traffic by 9:00 a.m. on Saturday, May 7.

Eastbound traffic will not be impacted, and all work is weather dependent. Detour signage will be visible and law enforcement will be stationed along the route to ensure driver safety.

The detour route will be as follows:

 Monroe Expressway Westbound Entrance (Closed to all traffic). Motorists will remain on US 74 to NC 200 (Morgan Mill Road); Right on NC 200 (Morgan Mill Road); Right on Monroe Expressway Westbound. Drivers need to use caution and slow down while going through the work zones and detour routes.

#### **Healthy Homes Spring Tips**

By Roshunda Terry, County Extension Director: Spring is in the air! And, unfortunately, that means allergens are in the air as well. As we start to open our windows, it is important to ventilate bathrooms and kitchens, and use whole house ventilation to supply fresh air and reduce the concentration of contaminants in the home. For more tips on a keeping a healthy home, here are our 8 principles of a healthy home:

- Keep it dry: Prevent water from entering the home through leaks in roofing systems, prevent rainwater from entering the home due to poor drainage, and check interior plumbing for any leaking.
- Keep it clean: Control the source of dust and contaminants, by creating smooth and cleanable surfaces, reducing clutter and using effect wet-cleaning methods.
- Keep it safe: Store poisons out of the reach of children and properly label. Secure loose rugs and keep children's play area free from hard or sharp surfaces. Install smoke and carbon monoxide detectors and keep fire extinguishers on hand.
- Keep it well ventilated: Ventilate bathrooms and kitchens and use whole home ventilation for supplying fresh air to reduce the concentration of contaminants
- Keep it pest-free: All pests look for food, water and shelter. Seal cracks and openings throughout the home; store food in pest-resistant containers. If needed, use sticky-traps and baits in closed containers, along with least-toxic pesticides such as boric acid powder.
- Keep it contaminant-free: Reduce lead-related hazards in pre-1978 homes by fixing deteriorated paint and keeping floors and window areas clean using the wet-cleaning approach. Test the home for radon, a naturally occurring dangerous gas that enters the homes through soil, crawlspaces, and foundation cracks. Install a radon removal

system if levels above EPA(US Environmental Protection Agency) action level are detected. Keep it well maintained: Inspect, clean

and repair the home routinely. Take care of minor repairs and problems before they become large repairs and problems. • Keep it thermally con-

trolled: Houses that do not maintain adequate temperatures may place the safety of residents at increased risk from exposure to extreme cold or heat. This information
