Jamie Rorie Charged with Murder of His Brother

On Friday, May 2, 2025, at approximately 9:00 a.m. the Anson County Sheriff's Office was notified of a deceased individual located on Cox Road in Anson County. Neighbors in the area reported a suspicious odor and, upon investigating, officers discovered



the body and immediately alerted the authorities. Deputies from the Anson County Sheriff's Office, along with agents from the North Carolina State Bureau of Investigation (SBI) and personnel from the Office of the Chief Medical Examiner, responded to the scene and began a thorough investigation.

The deceased was identified as Garry Hinson, a male from Wadesboro. After speaking with family members and friends, investigators determined that Hinson was last seen on Saturday, April 26, 2025, in Wadesboro.

On Sunday, May 4 an autopsy was performed, and it was determined that Hinson died from a gunshot wound. Following the investigation, on Thursday, May 8 Jamie Rorie, 33, the brother of the victim, was arrested and charged with Hinson's murder. Rorie is currently being held in the Anson County Jail without bond. His initial court appearance is scheduled for May 20, 2025, in Wadesboro District Court.

Sheriff Howell expressed gratitude to the State Bureau of Investigation for their assistance and commended the community for their cooperation. "Long hours and long days early in this investigation were critical in collecting valuable information from the community, which led to the swift resolution of this case," said Sheriff Howell. "We deeply appreciate the support and trust the community places in our office, which is vital in keeping Anson County safe."

Sheriff Howell also extended condolences and prayers to all families affected by this tragedy.

This remains an active and ongoing investigation. Anyone with information related to this case - or any other criminal activity - is urged to contact the Anson County Sheriff's Office at 704-694-4188. Callers may remain anonymous.

Slow Down and Move Over for Stopped Emergency Vehicles

The N.C. Governor's Highway Safety Program and state allows the more timid dogs to duck behind it and local law enforcement have launched a statewide enforcement campaign to remind drivers of the importance of the Move Over Law. The campaign is from May 12-18.

North Carolina's Move Over Law requires drivers to move over a lane or slow down when approaching emergency vehicles stopped on the side of the road with flashing blue, red or amber lights. The law protects law enforcement officers, emergency services workers and people working along the roadside with the N.C. Department of Transportation.

"Our emergency transportation and utility responders put themselves in harm's way each day to keep our roads safe," said GHSP Director Mark Ezzell. "The Move Over Law is not just a suggestion; it's the law, and a crucial component to ensure the safety of these responders and others.

People who violate the Move Over Law could face a \$250 fine and misdemeanor or felony charges, if someone is injured or property is damaged.
