She received the Hank Drake Civitan Scholarship to study biology at UNC-Charlotte. Kayla Jones, an Anson New Tech student from Peachland, plans to study nursing at Richmond Community College before transferring to a four-year school. She was named the Larry Crandell Civitan Scholar. Krystal Tillman, an Anson High Student from Morven, was awarded the James Martin Civitan Scholarship. She plans to study Psychology and Business at UNC-Charlotte.

All of the applicants were well-prepared academically for a college career, but according to Sandra Pliescott, Chair of the Civitan Scholarship Committee, these four stand out for their willingness to take on leadership roles in their churches, schools and clubs, or showed out-
