Statement from the Governor on Proposed Cuts to SNAP

Governor Josh Stein released this statement

on proposed federal cuts to the Supplemental

Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP):

"SNAP helps 1.4 million North Carolinians put food on the table. Congress's proposed cuts are unprecedented and would make North Carolina pay up to \$700 million to continue current benefits, all so that the wealthiest Americans can receive even bigger tax cuts. If Congress goes forward with these plans, our state will be forced into perilous budget decisions should North Carolinians lose access to food, or should we get rid of other essential services? I urge our members of Congress to reject this budget proposal so that North Carolina families don't go hungry.

Currently, the federal government covers 100% of food benefits for SNAP participants. Now, Congress has proposed shifting food benefit costs to states for the first time in the program's history.

North Carolina footing \$700 million in SNAP benefits for the first time would be the

equivalent of $8,900\ \text{K-}12$ public school teacher positions.

Four in five families participating in SNAP in NC have either a child, a senior, or an adult with a disability in the household. Each dollar in support for paying for groceries through SNAP frees up household resources for other essential needs like rent, utilities, or child care.

SNAP contributes nearly \$2.8 billion to North Carolina's economy, and has a multiplier effect, with every \$1 invested in SNAP benefits generating between \$1.50 and \$1.80 for local economies. SNAP cuts would mean people have less to spend at NC's more than 9,200 SNAP retailers, which would hurt farmers, the larger food distribution pipeline, and local economies overall, especially in rural areas and small towns.

SNAP is playing a vital role in supporting western North Carolinians impacted by Hurricane Helene. The 25 western NC counties most impacted by Helene still have higher enrollment in SNAP in April 2025 than they did in September 2024 before the storm hit. Notably, immediately after the storm, SNAP received 169,000 applications – the highest number of applications since Hurricane Florence in 2018. Last week, Governor Stein sent a letter to Congress laying out the implications for North Carolina if SNAP cuts move forward.

North Carolina's April Employment Figures Released

The state's seasonally adjusted April 2025 unemployment rate was 3.7 percent, changed from March's revised rate. The national rate was unchanged at 4.2 percent. North Carolina's unemployment rate increased 0.1 of a percentage point from a year ago. The number of people employed decreased 81 over the month to 5,098,151 and increased 1,063 over the year. The number of people unemployed increased 1,173 over the month to 196,360 and increased 7,959 over the year.

Seasonally adjusted Total Nonfarm employment, as gathered through the monthly establishment survey, increased $18,\!100$ to $5,\!094,\!100$ in April. Major industries experiencing increases were Professional & Business Services, 4,500; Trade, Transportation & Utilities, 4,000; Leisure & Hospitality Services, 2,800; Private Education & Health Services, 2,200; Manufacturing, 2,100; Other Services, 1,500; Government, 900; Construction, 200; Information, 200; and Mining & Logging, 100. The only major industry experiencing a decrease was Financial Activities, 400.

Since April 2024, Total Nonfarm jobs increased 76,700 with the Total Private sector increasing by 60,900 and Government increasing by 15,800. Major industries experiencing increases were Private Education & Health Services, 20,300; Professional & Business Services, 17,800; Government, 15,800; Trade, Transportation & Utilities, 11,300; Construction, 6,700; Other Services, 5,400; Leisure & Hospitality Services, 3,300; Financial Activities, 1,700; and Mining & Logging, 300. Major industries experiencing decreases over the year were Manufacturing, 5,300; and Information, 600.
