Arthur always had time for others and was a genuine people person. He loved meeting and getting to know people and did his best to make those around him happy. He loved his family dearly and big brother, Battle, says he always felt (among other things!) Arthur's love. Arthur looked forward to Christmas and spending time with his brother and family in Charlotte.
