Rockingham Man Drowns at the Pee Dee River Boat Landing on Memorial Day

Anson County Sheriff's Deputies investigated a drowning at the Pee Dee River, below Lilesville, late Monday afternoon (Memorial Day). Deputies were called to an area near the NC Wildlife public boat landing around 7 p.m. on Monday, May 27th. Witnesses told officers that Matthew Callahan, age 26, was swimming across the cove when he appeared to be in some distress. One person attempted to swim out to him, but Callahan went under before the rescuer could get to him. Callahan never surfaced again. Rescue Squads from Anson and Richmond Counties responded to the situation. The body was recovered around 11 p.m. Monday night.

Sheriff Tommy Allen said that this appears to be a tragic accident. "These things start happening this time of the year. This is kind of a remote area, but is a place often used for swimming, partying, drinking and such," Allen said. " People come from both counties, even though it's on the Anson County side. The water is still pretty cold. We're not sure what contributed to his distress.

The Sheriff said he would not know if alcohol or hypothermia was involved until after the medical examiner finished their investigation.

Callahan's address was listed as Rockingham.

Wadesboro Police Officers **Meet with Governor McCrory**

On Monday, May 20th North Carolina launched its Memorial Day Click it or Ticket campaign, orchestrated by the Governor's Highway Safety Program (GHSP), marking the program's 20th anniversary. In 1993, North Carolina launched the Click it or

Ticket safety initiative and it was the first of its kind. Now, nearly every State in the nation has implemented the initiative that has drastically increased seatbelt use nationwide, and has grossly reduced traffic fatalities.

In recognition of the anniversary and launch of the Click it or Ticket campaign, under the direction of Chief Thedis L. Spencer, the Wadesboro Police Department conducted a nighttime seatbelt enforcement safety initiative on Monday, May 20. Enforcement was focused on Westbound US 74 traffic in the Wade Mill area of Wadesboro. At the end of the two hour operation nearly 20 enforcement actions were taken on restraint violations, along with a DWI charge and a texting while driving enforcement action. Officer Joshua Leviner with the department's Highway Interdiction Team (HIT) stated that he was "shocked" by how many safety belt violations were observed during the operation. Patrol Lieutenant Steven Kelly

headed up the operation. On Tuesday, May 21 Leviner along with officers Scott Gulledge and Brandon Smith, in recognition for the department's continued efforts n enforcing and promoting

Safe Kids Anson Urges Parents to Teach Children Bicycle Safety

The new trike paths allow these children to experience the joy of riding bikes," said Kim Wilson, Safe Kids Anson Coordinator. "It's important they are protected properly so they are free to learn and test their capabilities

Wilson continued, "There are so many great reasons to ride bikes: It offers fun, freedom and exercise. We encourage kids and families to ride their bikes as much as possible, however safety should be a priority. More children ages 5 to 14 are seen in emergency rooms for injuries related to biking than any other sport. Helmets can reduce the risk of severe brain injuries by 88 percent yet only 45 percent of children 14 and under usually wear a bike helmet."

Wilson concluded, "We have a simple saying: 'Use your head, wear a helmet.' It is the single most effective safety device available to reduce nead injury and death from bicycle crashes.

Kids learn from watching you, so it's extra important for parents to model proper behavior. Wear a helmet, even if you didn't when you were a kid. Your children's helmet should meet the US Consumer Product Safety Commission's standards. When it's time to purchase a new helmet, let your children pick out their own. They'll be more likely to wear it for every ride.

Law Enforcement Officers Honored

In a release from Sheriff Tommy Allen: The week of May 13th was National Law Enforcement Officers' Memorial Week. All across the country cities, counties, states and national organizations recognized and remembered those law enforcement officers who died in the line of duty. Anson County recognized its fallen law enforcement officers as well as those retired officers and those currently active duty officers who protect us daily in a memorial ceremony held on Wednesday, May 15th.

The event was held in the courthouse at twelve noon. Speakers included Sheriff Tommy Allen and Wadesboro Police Chief Thedis Spencer. Chief Spencer gave remarks that included the reason and purpose of the ceremony. Sheriff Allen spoke of the 127 officers who died in the line of duty in 2013, noting that over 19,000 officers have been killed since the first recorded officer died in 1791. Sheriff Allen also read the names of each of the eight officers in Anson County to die in the line of duty. Those officers were: James Marion Sings, 1910; Mattie George Faulkner, 1926; George I. Thompson, 1929; Selby Harney, Sr., 1973; Gilbert Dean, 1977; William Kress Horne, 1984; Jesse Lee Pratt, 2001 and Josh W. Oliver, 2004. A memorial video was then played that included the pictures of each officer, some statistics on officer's line of duty deaths, taps and closing with a moment of silence. Members of the Faulkner family and Sings family were present for the ceremony.
