Join in the Nationwide Star-Spangled **Banner Bicentennial Celebration on June 14**

NC Museum of History partners with Smithsonian for a nationwide singing of the National Anthem to celebrate

Americans will "Raise It Up!" on Flag Day, Saturday, June 14, and come together to participate in potentially the largest unified event in



American history, turning the national anthem into "the song that was heard around the world." The N.C. Museum of History in Raleigh is proud to be a national partner and encourages you to participate in Raise It Up! Anthem for America, a global celebration of the 200th anniversary of the Star-Spangled Banner and the lyrics penned in 1814 by Francis Scott Key after the victorious Battle of Baltimore during the War of 1812. Led by the Smithsonian's National Museum of American History from the National Mall in Washington, D.C., the vision is for Americans across the country and around the world to stop at the same time at 4 p.m. and sing the national anthem.

> Of course this had nothing that all this preceded the era of the van. There are several areas of community service that were (and still are) being helped financially with the Smith monies.

Experience this once-in-a-lifetime event at the N.C. Museum of History, a Smithsonian-affiliated museum, on June 14. At the museum, watch the live webcast of the Smithsonian's sing-along concert in Washington, D.C., on its National Mall Terrace from 2:30 to 4 p.m. This will culminate in a "moment of national unity" at 4 p.m., when Americans around the globe will sing "The Star-Spangled Banner." Raise It Up! Anthem for America will include musical performances from America's top artists and the singing of American patriotic songs by national music groups. Admission and weekend parking are free at the N.C. Museum of History.

The National Museum of American History is home to the Star-Spangled Banner, the flag that inspired the national anthem. Made in the summer of 1813 by Mary Pickersgill (1776-1857), a professional flag maker, the flag was originally 30 feet by 42 feet with 15 red and white wool stripes and 15 cotton stars on the blue canton. After the war, the flag was privately owned for many years until Eben Appleton lent it to the Smithsonian Institution in 1907 and converted the loan to a gift in 1912. Beginning in 1998, the Star-Spangled Banner underwent extensive conservation treatment. It is now on display in a custom-built, environmentally controlled chamber at the museum.

The annual 4-H Youth Livestock Show will be held at Circle G Arena on Friday and Saturday, and the Ag Fair will be held at the Extension Center in Wadesboro on Saturday. Due to having the events in different locations, the full Expo as has been held in past years will be on hiatus for 2014. The 4-H Youth Livestock Show will begin at 6 p.m. on Friday and again at 9 a.m. on Saturday in Lilesville. The Ag Fair will be open to the public on Saturday from 9 a.m. until 2 p.m. in Wadesboro.

While this year's planning committee is gearing up to promote agriculture and natural resources in Anson County, they did not want to leave out established popular events for the public. So some of the traditional Expo events may be offered at another time and venue.
