Freeman has been appointed to the position Superintendent following a comperecruitment process conducted by the North Carolina Boards School Association on behalf of the Anson County Board of Education.

Freeman, a local

candidate for Superintendent who has worked for Anson County Schools his whole career, was selected after he completed the interview process. The ACS Board of Education approached this process with the sincere effort of recruiting the very best ACS Superintendent they could.

Freeman was appointed Interim Superintendent following the resignation of former Superintendent, Dr. Greg Firn in early 2013. Freeman is now transitioning into the Superintendent's position permanently based on his appointment by the Board of Education on Tuesday, June 4, 2013.

When I contacted Freeman, he said, "I feel so honored to have been selected to continue my career with Anson County Schools by serving as the new Superintendent. I am looking forward to being the leader of a team who will ensure that each student attending Anson County Schools will learn and be prepared for life beyond high school."

Many citizens from within the geographical boundaries of Anson County and throughout the state of North Carolina have rallied to endorse Michael Freeman as the new ACS Superintendent. A public survey was conducted by the North Carolina School Boards Assocation for the Anson County School System which offered citizens of Anson County a chance to become involved with the choice of Superintendent. According to Allison Schafer, Director of Policy and Legal Counsel at the NC School Boards Association, Anson's survey had the highest per capita return rate of any school system ever, with over 800 completed surveys. Freeman was chosen by over 90% of the respondents.

Freeman added, "I will need every citizen, including children and adults, to join me as we all strive to accelerate Anson County Schools to new levels of success. From the Sheriff's Desk

The recent tragic drowning at the Pee Dee River reminds me that as we go into the warm summer months more and more people will now be outside fishing, swimming and going on vacations. Tragedies can occur even with the best planning and using caution. However, very often many of these can be prevented. The rivers that border two sides of our county are heavily used for boating, fishing, and in some areas swimming. But when individuals don't wear life jackets while in boats, fish in prohibited or restricted areas or swim far away from shore or river banks tragedy can occur. Another factor that often plays a major role is putting alcohol or illegal drugs into this mix. Judgment becomes impaired. That shore that someone decides to swim over to is actually a lot further away than it looks.

This also begins vacation time for many families and there are several things you should or should not do prior to leaving to make your time away and your return a lot happier. The number one thing you should never do is to post on a social network sites such as Facebook or Twitter that you are going to be out of town. It may be hard to believe but individuals will post their vacations plans on these sites, saying when and what day they are leaving and when they expect to return. You've just told the world where there is an empty house for several days. There are people out there who scan these sites to see who is not home.

Do let a trusted neighbor or relative know you will be away and ask them to watch your house and call the police if they see any suspicious activity. You also want your home to look like someone is there. A couple of timers on lights or TVs inside are good investments. Stop mail and newspaper deliveries or have that trusted neighbor or relative pick up these for you daily. Have someone mow the lawn if you are away more than a week.

Your local police department or your sheriff's office will check your home daily while you are away if you will call and ask them to do so. Be sure to leave them with contact information if they find something out of place or suspicious.
