Roy Gaddy to Perform at Fort Jackson

About two months ago Anson County's own Elvis Presley tribute artist Roy Gaddy received a call to do a very special show. He was asked to perform for the troops and law enforcement officers who were graduating from the Police Academy at Fort Jackson in Columbia, South Carolina on June 22. A birthday party is also scheduled at the same time. To add to the excitement, Gaddy was told that dignitaries from Washington, D.C., Texas Missouri and Oklahoma would also be in attendance.

Roy's "Tribute to the Troops" performance already has over 275 seats reserved, and calls are still coming in tickets. According to organizers this event will be packed out, and the biggest such event ever. According to Gaddy, "The Army will be there, as well as the Police Academy, the Marines, retired military personnel and their

Gaddy recently was honored and inducted into the "King's Hall of Fame" in the book entitled Second Generation Kings. Gaddy is honored to be great friends with Beach Music Hall of Famer and gold record recording artist Ed Dement of the O'Kaysions. They made the song I'm a Girl Watcher and other popular songs. Gaddy and Dement performed together for the residents of Meadowview Terrace Assisted Living Center on May 30th. "That was a special event," said Gaddy. The pair have performed together for several months, described as a big hit with audiences.

Roy has also performed with world champions David Lee and Keith Henderson. He describes Champion Michael Spalding, who portrays young Elvis and Michael Jackson, as a great friend.

Gaddy also performs with others who portray Johnny Cash, Neil Diamond, George Jones, Tammy Wynette, Patsy Cline and many more. This talented group of performers get together the second Tuesday of every month at Blue Bay Restaurant in Albemarle at 6 p.m. for the meeting of the Friends of Elvis Fan Club Meeting.
