No repayment of this down payment assistance is due if the buyer remains in the home for 15 years, with the loan being forgiven at 20 percent per year after 10 years. First-time buyers and military veterans can benefit even more with a Mortgage Credit Certificate issued by the Agency, which enables buyers to save up to \$2,000 per year on their federal taxes for the life of their home loan, leaving new homeowners with more money in their pocket to pay their mortgage. Last year, the Agency's home buying programs helped more than 5,000 North Carolinians with moderate incomes purchase homes, with nearly a quarter of them purchasing newly built homes.
