Anson County's Unemployment Rate at 6.1 Percent in April

Anson County's unemployment rate for April was 5.8 percent. In March the rate was 6.1 percent. Statewide the unemployment rate for April was 5 percent.

Anson's total labor force in April was 10,946. Of that number 10,313 were employed and 633 were unemployed. In March the total labor force was 11,052, with 10,380 employed and 672 unemployed.

Unemployment rates (not seasonally adjusted) decreased in 95 of North Carolina's counties in April, increased in three, and remained unchanged in two. Scotland County had the highest unemployment rate at 9.5 percent, while Buncombe County had the lowest at 3.7 percent.

rate decreases and one remained unchanged. Among the Metro areas, Rocky Mount at 7.6 percent experienced the highest rate and Asheville had the lowest rate at 3.9 percent. The April not seasonally adjusted statewide rate was 5.0 percent. When compared to the same month last year, not

seasonally adjusted unemployment rates decreased in 94 counties, increased in two, and remained unchanged in four. All 15 metro areas experienced rate decreases over the year.

Anson Farmers Eligible for Emergency Loan Assistance

Deadline to apply is June 27

On October 26 President Obama declared a major disaster in the State of South Carolina based on damages and losses caused by severe storms and flooding that occurred from October 1 to 23, 2015. In accordance with Section 321(a) of the Consolidated Farm and Rural Development Act, six adjacent counties in North Carolina are named as contiguous counties where eligible family farmers may qualify for FSA emergency (EM) loan assistance. These counties are Anson, Mecklenburg, Richmond, Robeson, Scotland and Union.

Effective October 26, 2015, farmers in Anson County may apply for EM loans for physical and production losses. June 27, 2016, is the deadline for filing an application. The local office is located at 3230-A Presson Road, Monroe, NC 28112-9196, with office hours of $8\ a.m.$ to $4{:}30\ p.m.$ Any farmer who suffered a physical or production loss should contact his/her office for additional information.


