### Kate B. Reynolds Charitable Trust Grants \$222,000 to HOLLA!

The Kate B. Reynolds Charitable Trust announced that HOLLA! has been selected to receive \$222,000 in grants. HOLLA!'s grant was among 54 new grants totaling over \$12 million that were approved by the Trustee in the Health Care Division's most recent grant cycle. These grants will support select statewide initiatives, as well as programs offered by individual nonprofits within all four of the Division's funding interests.

Leon Gatewood, the founder of HOLLA! said, "I am excited to announce that HOLLA! has been selected to receive a \$222,000.00 grant from The Kate B. Reynolds Charitable Trust to address obesity in underprivileged youth in Anson County. The three-year grant provides \$90,000 in funds for capital purchases plus \$40,000 in operating expenses for the first year; and \$40,000 in operating expenses for each of the next two years. The grant also provides \$12,000 in 'incidental' expenses. These funds will allow HOLLA! to more effectively address some of the issues hindering our children's progression toward

growing into healthy, productive citizens."

Gatewood added, "Our full appreciation goes to Susan Richardson and the selection committee at Kate B. Reynolds

Charitable Trust for supporting our efforts to serve our community!'

HOLLA! received a \$250,000 grant in December 2009 from the Golden Leaf Organization. Those funds helped in the creation of the HOLLA! Center, located at 229 East Main Street in Morven. The center was dedicated in March of 2011. About the Kate B. Reynolds Trust grants: In general, these funds will be invested in programs and organizations that focus

on: access to primary medical care (31%), community change (5%), diabetes care and management (7%), and mental health and substance abuse (42%). Other awards (totaling 15% of funds) will support programs exploring mental health issues and local health promotion and wellness efforts.

Funds supporting statewide efforts were awarded to initiatives like Rural Hope II, a project of the Rural Economic Development Center, P.A.C.E., an evidence-based program that provides care for our most vulnerable older adults, and Reclaiming Futures. The Trust also awarded the State's Department of Health and Human Services bridge funding to augment budget cuts to medication assistance programs that benefit low-income North Carolinians.

Similar to Trust's fall 2010 grant awards, over half of these funds will support projects and organizations serving primarily Tier 1 counties, contributing directly to the Trust's mission of improving the life and health of low-income North Carolinians.

These awards continue the Health Care Division's strategic grantmaking around its four funding interests—access to care, community-centered prevention, diabetes, and mental health and substance abuse," affirms Karen McNeil-Miller, President of the Kate B. Reynolds Charitable Trust. "We are pleased with the opportunity to be a partner in a new statewide effort towards the widespread establishment of PACE in North Carolina, the new partnership with The Rural Center, and new commitments towards nonprofit capacity building and leadership development.

The Trust invests for results in organizations within North Carolina that can directly impact the health of the financially disadvantaged. The Health Care Division receives three-fourths of grant funds distributed by the Trust. To review a list of recent grants made by both Divisions of
