- Second Harvest Food Bank of Metrolina (Charlotte, N.C.)



WADESBORO POLICE DISPATCH CONSOLIDATION

Wadesboro Police Department for many years has utilized their own dispatch center to

handle Police dispatching. Effective July 1, 2022, Anson County Communications (Anson 911) will assume those responsibilities to better facilitate the most up to date communications possible. Through this partnership Wadesboro will utilize the most state-of-the-art radio equipment, which increases officer safety through better lines of communication with an Emergency Dispatch Center.

Anson County is very fortunate to have one of the most technologically advanced Emergency Dispatch Centers in the State. When it was built, one of the purposes was to centralize all communications in the county. The last leg of the technology needed for this, a modernized radio system, went live June 1, 2022, and allows the Emergency Telecommunicator to track radio traffic much more efficiently. This serves to improve the safety of police officers, EMS personnel, and fire personnel in Anson County.

What does this mean for the citizens of Wadesboro? Effective immediately, the 704-694-2167 traditionally used by citizens to call police dispatch will no longer connect you to the Wadesboro Dispatch Center; an automated service will answer the 704-694-2167 number and redirect you to the destination you choose. As always, if you have an emergency and immediate assistance is needed, please call 911. Officer safety is paramount in the decision to make this change. We look forward to continuing to meet the needs of our citizens as this change takes place. Once again, for ANY emergency response needed, call 911. The numbers below listed for Town functions are strictly non-emergency purposes.
