Anson's May Unemployment Rate was 5.2% - Same as April

Anson County's unemployment rate for May remained the same as April at 5.2%. Statewide the unemployment rate did the same thing, remaining 4.3% in May, same as in April.

Here are May unemployment rates in Anson County for each of the last seven years: 2010 13.6%; 2011 11.7%; 2012 11.7%; 2013 10.4%; 2014 7.9%; 2015 6.6% and 2016 5.3%

Anson's total labor force in May was 10,577. Of that number 10,026 were employed and 551 were unemployed. In April the total labor force was 10,667 with 10,114 employed and 553 unemployed.

Unemployment rates (not seasonally adjusted) increased in 67 of North Carolina's counties in May, decreased in 13, and remained unchanged in 20. Edgecombe and Scotland Counties each had the highest unemployment rate at 7.8 percent, while Buncombe County had the lowest at 3.3 percent. Thirteen of the state's metro areas experienced rate increases and two remained unchanged.

Among the metro areas, Rocky Mount at 6.8 percent had the highest rate and Asheville had the lowest rate at 3.5 percent. The May not seasonally adjusted statewide rate was 4.3 percent.

When compared to the same month last year, not seasonally adjusted unemployment rates decreased in 97 counties, increased in one, and remained unchanged in two. Fourteen metro areas experienced rate decreases over the year and one increased.

The number of workers employed statewide (not seasonally adjusted) increased in May by 5,145 to 4,709,722, while those unemployed increased 4,347 to 212,911. Since May 2016, the number of workers employed statewide increased 64,923, while those unemployed decreased 14,348.

Candidate filing for local elections across North Carolina began last Friday, July 7, and run through noon Friday, July 21. Local elections are held between September and November, depending on the rules governing particular types of election contests. This year, more than 1,000 contests will be held across the state.

In Anson County elections will be held on Tuesday, November 7. The voter registration deadline is October 13.

Candidates for local office must file notices of candidacy with the proper county board of elections to be listed on ballots in the primary or general elections. Candidates must be at least 21 years old. They also must live and be registered to vote in the electoral district for the office being sought. Voters must be registered 25 days before an election to vote on Election Day.

The regular voter registration deadline for September elections is August 18. For October elections the deadline is September 15. For November elections the egistration deadline is October 13. Please contact your county board of elections or visit its website for more information

Treasurer Folwell Announces "AAA" Bond Ratings for NC

North Carolina State Treasurer Dale R. Folwell, CPA announced today that all three major national bond rating agencies have re-affirmed the State's "AAA" bond rating, all with stable outlooks, in preparation for the upcoming sale of approximately \$106 million of General Obligation (GO) Bonds and \$300 million in Limited Obligation Bonds (LOB). The GO and LOBs are scheduled to be competitively sold later this month. The bonds are being issued to take advantage of lower interest rates, thus reducing interest costs for taxpayers.

"The transactions refund over \$400 million of bonds originally issued to fund important projects around the state including schools, roads and other infrastructure improvements, said Treasurer Folwell. "Since we are able to take advantage of historically low interest rates and our "AAA" bond ratings, we will save tens of millions of dollars.

North Carolina is one of only 12 states to earn the "AAA" bond rating by all three rating agencies.

Each of the rating agencies commented on the state's diverse economic base; history of conservative fiscal management; a commitment to strong reserves as well as managing debt and pension liabilities.
