

This park will provide a place for meaningful reflection and inspiration in a community setting that is beautiful, bold and unique to honor the lives, service and pride of North Carolina veterans who served in all five branches of our nations military.

Anson County should be proud that we were represented with such a distinguished group. Everyone is encouraged to visit the park to see the permanent exhibit of the pylon that represents Anson County. The park is located at 300 Bragg Blvd, Fayetteville, North Carolina.

Logan Goodwin Provides Stuffed Animals Once Again!



For the fifth year in a row, Logan Goodwin, age nine, and his grandmother, Diane Goodwin have given the Anson County Sheriff's Office a new supply of 150 stuffed animal and figures. These are given out to kids in crisis situations. The Sheriff's Office uses them and distributes them to other law enforcement agencies, DSS and Domestic Violence. These agencies, along with the Sheriff's Office, give them out to children at accident scenes, police calls, domestic violence or any situation where small children are frightened and need something to "hug" or hold on to.

Sheriff Tommy Allen said, "Sometimes children are in the middle of very harsh situations. Life's not always fair and little children seem to be where it's the most unfair. I've seen these stuffed animals dry up tears and give a trembling child something secure to hold on to. I want to thank Logan and Diane for starting this project here five years ago.

"Logan told me he hoped one day we could have these stuffed animals to give out to children who were NOT sad, and that no child would cry or be unhappy. Now that makes you stop and think," Allen said. Since this project began churches, other organizations and individuals have helped keep a good supply on hand at the Sheriff's Office, along with Logan's donations.

Anson/Stanly Creativity Economy Project Takes Another Step

On Friday, June 10, participants in the regional Creativity Economy initiative in Anson and Stanly Counties met at the Cooperative Extension Center in Wadesboro to begin the next phase of the project. To help launch upcoming community work, special guests Keith Crisco, NC Secretary of Commerce and Anita Brown-Graham, Director of the Institute for Emerging Issues at NC State University, met with the group.

Secretary Crisco reported that the creative sector in North Carolina brought in \$41 billion dollars last year, as opposed to \$17 billion in tourism and \$74 billion in agriculture. He explained, "Creativity is the fiber of our economy and will bring communities into the next generation. That is because creative companies and creative working atmospheres allows

you to hire the best and the brightest. Director Brown-Graham explained to the group that creativity does not benefit only urban areas. That is why this initiative was implemented. She told the group, "Creativity is not a passing fad. Neither is it a top-down imposed effort." She explained that to truly take advantage of this opportunity,

we have to harness the creative potential in our communities. The group nominated a steering committee chair and cochair for the project going forward. They are Nancy Lipe of Falling Rivers Gallery in Albemarle and David Whitesides,

Printshop Coordinator at SPCC. Priority creative strategies that will be implemented in the coming months were also announced, and chairs were

nominated. They are: • Encourage visual and performing arts venues in the two

- counties to coordinate and combine their marketing efforts, Edna Lipe-Harkey of Stanly County.
- Develop and promote a "Taste of the Pee Dee Festival," David Smith of Anson County.
- Increase signage to promote roadside tourism throughout Anson and Stanly Counties (especially on Highways 74 and 52), Chris Lambert of Stanly County.

Extension announced that \$10,000 is available in the overall grant that can be allocated to ongoing project work in Anson and Stanly Counties.

At the close of the meeting, participants described factors that can influence successful outcomes, including money to support projects, staff positions, involving young people, communication, a shorter name for the overall initiative, and developing a logo and a brand.
