1929 North Carolina Highway Patrol

I do remember, just slightly, when the North Carolina Highway Patrol was organized in 1929. Highway 52 was being paved, and the overhead bridge (located on the short stretch of Old 52 in Wadesboro) was built then also.

All the troopers did not have cars, only the "top brass." The others rode motorcycles. All of this was something new for North Carolina! After organizing and being sworn in, the different officers rode their motorcycles to their various assignments.

The first North Carolina patrolman fatality was here in Wadesboro. While on the way to his assignment in the mountains, Ira Thompson was killed when his motorcycle collided with a car that had failed to stop for the sign at an intersection. This information and story published in The Messenger and Intelligencer, a copy of which was given to retired trooper, Wallace Adcock. Wallace, in turn, carried the article to be placed in the NC Highway Patrol Museum.

Many of the older officers who have served in Anson County are deceased or living in other areas. To my knowledge, officers Whitlock, Tant and Adcock all still live here in the county.


Sewer Service Along Highway 74 East to be Extended from Wade Manufacturing to McRae Road

extend an 8" sewer line east to McRae Avenue, the "mini mart" site.
