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Grant Pays Eligible 2021 NC High School Graduates Tuition and Fees for Up to Two Years

2021 North Carolina high school graduates who will attend South Piedmont Community College starting in the Fall 2021 semester. High school students may be eligible to receive this grant – not a loan – for tuition and fees toward a degree or to attain transfer credit.

Full-time eligible students are guaranteed to receive \$700 to \$2,800 per year, for a total of two years. Less than full-time students may receive a partial award. The Longleaf Commitment Grant Program ends at the conclusion of the 2023 spring semester.

Eligibility Requirements

Graduate from a North Carolina high school in 2021

Be a North Carolina resident for tuition purposes

Promise (CCP) and Early College High School students are eligible)

- Enroll in a curriculum program during the 2021-22 academic year
- Enroll in at least 6 credit hours per semester
- Complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) for 2021-22
- Have an Expected Family Contribution (EFC) from \$0 \$15,000. ("EFC" is based upon student's FAFSA determination)
- Renew FAFSA for the 2022-23 academic year and meet the Satisfactory Academic Progress requirements of the college

NC Quick Pass to Resume All Billing Procedures

Full invoice escalation policy scheduled to begin on Thursday, July 15

Starting July 15, NC Quick Pass will resume all regular escalation procedures for customers who have an invoice that is at least 90 days past due. In October of 2020, NC Quick Pass resumed the invoice escalation process with a few exceptions to provide customers extended relief due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

Anson County citizens who use the toll Monroe Bypass are customers of NC Quick Pass.

As the North Carolina Turnpike Authority returns to enforcing normal policies, NC Quick Pass customers should understand: Unpaid invoices will not be charged processing fees and civil penalties retroactively. • Customers with unpaid balances will now be subject to a DMV registration hold and/or be sent to a collection agency if their balance is 90 days past due. • Customers with an outstanding balance that have been sent to collections will now also be able to see their collections balance on future invoices. • Customers who traveled on a NC toll facility with an expired vehicle registration can now expect to receive an invoice for those tolls. • Fees are only assessed to accounts after an invoice is 30 days past due.
