Four Men Charged with Murder of Phillip Burgess on July 7

On Friday July 10 the Wadesboro Police Department, with assistance from the North Carolina SBI, was able to make an arrest in the case involving Phillip Burgess who was found deceased in the parking lot of

Tuesday, July 7 by a citizen, and initially it appeared that he was the victim of a hit and run. Upon further investigation it was determined that the fatal injuries Burgess suffered were the result of a severe beating, and that Burgess had been robbed. After many hours of investigation by

the Hair Shack, located on Highway 74 East. Burgess was discovered on

Wadesboro Police Department investigators and the SBI arrests were made on the following men: Quentin Cornelius Teal, age 22, of Wadesboro; Demetrian Teal, age 19 of Wadesboro; James Edward Henderson, Jr., age 19, of Cheraw; and Reginald Lamont Jenkins II, age 19, of Morven.

All Suspects were charged with First Degree Murder. They are being held at the Anson County Jail with no bond. The motive of this crime was robbery

"I would like to send my condolences to the victim's family, and thank them for their patience and trust they had in us during this investigation," said WPD Chief Thedis Spencer. "I would also like to thank the North Carolina State Bureau of Investigation and Anson County Emergency Services for their assistance with this investigation."


