Wadesboro Seeking Public Input on Pedestrian Network Plan

After receiving a grant to develop a comprehensive pedestrian plan, the Town of Wadesboro is seeking public input. Citizens are encouraged to give their feedback through a survey on *www.walkwadesboro.org*. The survey link is located about halfway down the webpage and highlighted in yellow. Paper copies of the survey are available at City Hall.

The Town of Wadesboro's vision is to develop a comprehensive and connected pedestrian network that provides safe access to homes, schools, workplaces, parks and recreational destinations as part of an active and walkable community. The town envisions children walking safely to school, seniors walking safely to nearby destinations, citizens moving safely in high traffic areas, and tourists moving about the community and uptown areas easily on foot.

Such a comprehensive and connected pedestrian network will enhance the health of Wadesboro's citizenry while also encouraging economic vitality through walkable commercial districts and neighborhoods.

Stride With Pride Shoe Drive Needs Your Contribution to Help Anson Youth

State Trooper Landric Reid started his Stride with Pride Shoe Drive in 2011 with hopes of helping underprivileged youth in Anson County. His idea is to provide tennis shoes to children who may not be fortunate enough to have them otherwise. As adults many of us may have forgotten how important a pair of tennis shoes can be to a young person. They literally can propel that person into athletic endeavors that otherwise may not have been possible. Even if the youth is not pursing a sport, a good pair of shoes is important just for getting along in school and life. Reid tackled this project with enthusiasm and a determination to help as many youth as he could.

Now in its fourth year, the Stride with Pride Shoe Drive has a goal to collect and provide 300 pairs of new tennis shoes to underprivileged youth of all diversities in Anson County. In the first three shoe drives shoes were collected for children from Kindergarten through eighth grade. This year the shoe drive will be extended to include students from Kindergarten through the twelfth grade. All sizes are needed.

In the previous three years Reid and his volunteers have collected and given out over 500 pairs of new tennis shoes.

Reid will be joined again in his effort by Patti Poulnott of Judy's Tax Service. Together they will be working to collect new tennis shoes and raise money from area supporters.

"We hope you will consider joining us in this effort to help a child walk the halls of success this new school year," said Tropper Reid. "Anyone who wishes to help can donate new tennis shoes and/or make a monetary donation to this important cause. Through your generous contributions we can help our youth 'Stride with Pride' this coming school year."
