### **Understanding Data & Gaps in Mental Health Among the Latino Community**

Connections, a family support program of Sandhills Center in collaboration with NC Families United, is sponsoring a program called Understanding Data & Gaps in Mental Health Among the Latino Community. The objective is to learn about access to mental health care for the Latino population and how to inform and improve service delivery and support to the Latino community. Lunch and resources will be provided at no cost.

The presenters are team members of Alianza – Center for Prevention Services from Charlotte (*preventionservices.org/alianza*) - Ricardo Torres, Jessica Montana, Fabbiana Gutierrez and Denisse Sanchez. The guest speakers will be speaking on the topic of how mental health services affect the Latino community. They will discuss the data and gaps in mental health among the Latino community compared to others, and how to improve service delivery and support to the Latino community.

Mr. Torres is from Puerto Rico, but has lived in Charlotte since 1982. He is currently serving on the board as Vice-Chair of Alianza with the Center for Prevention Services in Charlotte. He has developed two programs, one of which was awarded 4H's National Program of the Year. He has served the Charlotte Mecklenburg Police Department's Gang of One Program as a Gang Intervention Case Manager and currently works full time with Cardinal Innovations Healthcare as a Member Engagement Specialist.

Ms. Montana is currently the Latino Program Manager at the Center for Prevention Services, overseeing the Latino Program Department and the Alianza Latino Drug Free Coalition. She has experience implementing policies, systems and environmental level initiatives through her work with the CDC-funded Racial and Ethnic Approaches to Community Health (REACH) grant. She received her Master of Public Health in Community Health Education from the CUNY School of Public Health in New York City and is a Certified Health Education Specialist (CHES).

Ms. Gutierrez is from Ecuador, but has lived in Charlotte since 2005. She earned her BA degrees in International Studies and Dual Languages (Spanish & Chinese) from Queens University of Charlotte. As Alianza Coordinator, she supports the work of the executive team and coalition to prevent substance misuse among Latino youth and families in the Charlotte-Mecklenburg area.

Ms. Sanchez, born in Santa Barbara, CA, is of Mexican descent and has lived most of her life in Charlotte. She received her BS degree in Biology at UNC-Charlotte. As Alianza Youth Coordinator, she mentors, guides and teaches the youth. She has been a math and science tutor for the last four years.

Family members, providers, and professionals, such as teachers, social workers, case managers, therapists, counselors, and court counselors are encouraged to attend. Space is limited and we ask that you register in advance and no later than July 23rd. Resources and lunch will be provided at no charge.


