## 2,672 Total Cases of COVID-19 in Anson County, Increase of 20 Since Last Week

**Vaccines are available. Ansonians urged to get vaccinated.**

The latest information posted by the Anson County Health Department was 2,672 total Covid-19 cases, with 29 active as of Monday, July 19. The last report in The Express was from July 12, with 2,652 total cases and 11 active. The total deaths remain at 57.

The NC Department of Health and Human Services (NCDHHS) reported that statewide as of Monday, July 19 there were 734 new cases of COVID-19, with 13,535 deaths and 612 hospitalized. 59% of adults in NC were vaccinated with at least one dose, 56% were fully vaccinated.
