



## **Carolina Farm Credit Now Accepting** Applications for Ag Biz Planner Program

Carolina Farm Credit is now accepting applications for the fourth class of an e-learning financial and business planning course called Ag Biz Planner. The course is available to North Carolina farm families (www.carolinafarmcredit.com-/cfc3/loans-youngsmallfarmers-course-application.asp) and is funded through a grant from the North Carolina Tobacco Trust Fund Commission. The Ag Biz Planner curriculum includes financial and business planning, budgeting and other money matters essential to a farm's success. The online training will be offered statewide through North Carolina's three Farm Credit associations (Carolina Farm Credit, Ag Carolina Financial, and Cape Fear Farm Credit). The Farm Credit University curriculum includes financial and business planning, budgeting and other money matters essential to a farm's success. (www.fcuniversity.com/abp-main.htm)

This program is funded by a \$51, 775 grant from the North Carolina Tobacco Trust Fund Commission. The NC General Assembly established the commission in 2000 to help tobacco farmers, farm workers and related businesses impacted by the transition out of tobacco farming. The commission's funding comes from money paid by cigarette manufacturers as a result

of the 1998 Master Settlement Agreement.

Farm Credit's e-learning program targets young, beginning, small, and minority farmers throughout the state. Participants will be assigned a Farm Credit loan officer to serve as a mentor throughout the course. Highlights of the program include modules that cover business and personal financial planning, understanding income statements, cash flow, and the smart use of credit on the farm. Each participant will have completed a business plan for their operation at the conclusion of the class. Priority will be given to former tobacco farmers and others impacted by the Tobacco buyout. The grant provides for training 30 producers.

Carolina Farm Credit is accepting applications for the program which will begin in October of 2012 and run through March 2013. Applications, a course outline, program information, and testimonials from past participants are available at www.CarolinaFarmCredit.com. Applications will be accepted through September 1. The course will conclude with a group conference in Raleigh in March of 2013.

"This is a unique opportunity for a group of farmers to learn and benefit in ways that will certainly improve their family farm operations," said William Upchurch, Executive Director of the N.C. Tobacco Trust Fund Commission.
