According to the latest information posted by the Anson County Health Department on Wednesday, July 27 there were 7,225 total Covid-19 cases, with 165 active and 99 deaths.



# **Grants to Expand Internet Access** in 11 NC Counties Including Anson

Grants to connect 13,000 plus families to high-speed internet part of Governor Cooper's plan to close the digital divide

More than 13,000 households and 582 businesses across North Carolina are set to receive access to high-speed internet thanks to more than \$30.8 million in grants, Governor Roy Cooper announced on Monday. The N.C. Department of Information Technology's (NCDIT) awarded the following Growing Rural Economies with Access to Technology (GREAT) grants to expand broadband infrastructure:

Anson County: Spectrum Southeast, LLC (Charter

Communications) was one of the recipients. "All North Carolina communities, families and businesses

need access to reliable and affordable high-speed internet," Governor Cooper said. "This round of grants means more North Carolinians will be able to take advantage of opportunities to learn, work, access health care and connect to the world." Using funds from the federal American Rescue Plan Act

(ARPA), the GREAT program provides matching grants to internet service providers and electric membership cooperatives that may partner with individual N.C. counties to compete for funding to expand high-speed internet service to unserved areas of the state. NCDIT awarded more than \$23.4 million in GREAT grants to internet service providers in 12 counties on July 18 and will continue to make awards for the remainder of the \$350 million total GREAT grant funding in August. "We are excited to continue getting these GREAT grant

awards out as quickly as possible so providers can begin work to connect North Carolinians across the state to high-speed internet," said NCDIT Secretary and State Chief Information Officer Jim Weaver. "Our team is continuing to work to get more grants out the door to get more people connected."

NCDIT will share additional details about applications

and individual grant awards once its review process is complete and all awards have been made in August. For more information about the NCDIT Division of

## State Announces Record \$789.4M for Drinking Water and Wastewater Project Funding Statewide

Unprecedented 385 projects for 225 NC Applicants, including Anson County and local towns

Governor Roy Cooper announced that communities statewide will receive a record \$789.4 million in water and wastewater infrastructure funding to help pay for 385 projects statewide, including 140 construction projects. Anson County received two fundings: Wastewater AIA for \$100,000 and Water

- AIA for \$300,000. • The Town of Lilesville received \$4,537,830 in funding for Phase 4 Water Improvements.
- The Town of Peachland received \$5,709,055 in funding for Phase 1 Water Improvements. The Town of Wadesboro received two fundings: \$200,000 in funding for Water AIA
- and \$9,556,500 for Collection System Improvements.

"Clean drinking water is necessary for healthy families and thriving communities and businesses," said Governor Roy Cooper. "The historic level of investment provided by the American Rescue Plan will help increase resiliency, support economic growth in our state and improve access to clean water in the communities that need it most." The Department of Environmental Quality's Division of Water Infrastructure received

more than 700 applications from 94 of North Carolina's 100 counties, requesting more than \$3.1 billion. This funding round included the first awards of American Rescue Plan Act water and wastewater funding on the state level, as well as \$174,846,696 in funds that were appropriated in the 2022-23 state budget, signed by Governor Cooper

These funds will replace aging infrastructure and help utilities remain viable, which benefits the health and economic well-being of communities across our state," said DEO Secretary Elizabeth S. Biser.

The Division of Water Infrastructure website (deq.nc.gov) features a map illustrating the statewide distribution of funded projects in the Spring 2022 funding round.

The State Water Infrastructure Authority approved the awards during the July 14 meeting. Funding this round also came from the Viable Utility Reserve and the Drinking Water and Wastewater State Reserves, funded from American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) funds allocated to the State, and the Drinking Water and Clean Water State Revolving Funds. Projects funded from the Viable Utility Reserve are conditional upon approval by the Local Government Commission.

The Authority is an independent body with primary responsibility for awarding federal and state funding for water and wastewater infrastructure projects. Other responsibilities include developing a state water infrastructure master plan, recommending ways to maximize the use of available loan and grant funding resources, and examining best The application period for the next round of funding for water and wastewater

infrastructure projects, which will include the first ARPA stormwater funding, ends on Sept. 30 at 5:00 p.m. The application training schedule is available at: deq.nc.gov.
