Landi is a seven month old Bloodhound donated by the Chesterfield County Sheriff's Office. She will be used to track missing and endangered people as well as suspects who have left on foot from their home or from crime scenes.

During the month of July Landi was used in several searches where subjects left on foot and their whereabouts were unknown. One of tjpse searches was successful, locating a missing juvenile who had run away from home and was threatening to do harm to herself.

Sheriff Howell said, "I believe K9 Landi will be a great tool for the Sheriff's Office as well as a valuable asset to the citizens of Anson County."
