

A few years back (1956) I had the pleasure of assembling and lettering (inside & out) a promotional book about 'Wadesboro – A Finer Carolina Town.' It featured so much of our area – certainly not all, but some. This morning I picked one of these 'to remember.'

Ris Lyon's pride and joy was WADE radio! The picture above is of Walter Mitchell (left) and Bill Billingsley in the studio located on the third floor of the Fox and Lyon Building (That building was on the square and burned down on January 4, 1983.) I know beyond a 'shadow of a doubt' that at the moment the photo was taken the station was 'not on the air' – because Bill was not talking!!

Back to the Wadesboro promotion of what the town had to offer the population in 1954 was 3,407, and in 1956 it was 4,001. It was a joy and challenge to work on this project - but sad as I look over my work to see so many who have 'done their work' and moved on!!

The Fox and Lyon building, National Hotel building, Bank of Wadesboro, First National Bank are all gone now – so many changes. Some of the faces in the promotional book that I remember were 'Pap' Rayle, Robert Usrey, R. G. Taylor, Ris Lyon (Chairman, Finer Carolina), Claude Greene, and, of course, a picture of Buck Newton – lots of 'memorial history' of which we here in Anson County have plenty of.

And, yes, it has been awhile - fifty-four years - since the above story made 'history!' Ed

Together, Patti and Sheriff Reid will be working to collect donations of new shoes and monetary contributions from area supporters. They hope that you will consider joining them in this important effort to help a child walk the halls of success this new school year. "Though your generosity we can help our youth 'Stride with Pride' this coming school year," Patti said. "Collections are going on now through August 16. We hope you will consider joining us to help our local children.
