FAQ: Anson County Schools -HB 959 & Use of Wireless **Communication Devices Policy**

1. What is HB 959, and when does it take effect?

HB 959 is a new North Carolina law that focuses on regulating the use of wireless communication devices in schools and promoting safe, distraction-free learning environments. It takes effect January 1, 2026.

2. What are considered Wireless **Communication Devices?**

Wireless communication devices include, but are not limited to, cellular phones, electronic devices with internet capability, paging devices, two-way communication devices, wireless earbuds/headphones, tablets, and similar devices.

3. Does Anson County Schools already have a wireless communication device policy?

Yes. Our board-approved Policy 4318 states that students are permitted to possess such devices on school property so long as the devices are not activated, used, displayed, or visible during the instructional day or as otherwise directed by school rules or school personnel.

4. Are there any changes to the current policy right now?

No. There are no changes to our cell phone policy at this time. Policies will be reviewed and updated as needed before the January 2026 deadline. We are working closely with state education policy advisors and school governance experts to ensure our policies remain aligned with the law before the January 2026 deadline. If changes are needed, we will share them with families.

5. What are the current rules for elementary and middle school students?

Wireless communication devices as defined above shall not be activated, used, displayed, or visible during the instructional day or as otherwise directed by school rules or school personnel from the moment students step onto campus until the end of the school day. In addition, elementary students who participate in after-school care programs are prohibited from using wireless communication devices during such programs.

6. What are the current rules for high school students?

Students may have devices out before and after school, as well as during lunch in the cafeteria. Devices must be off and out of sight during instructional time unless authorized by a teacher or administrator.

7. Are there exceptions for medical or learning needs?

Yes. This policy does not override accommodations in a 504 Plan, IEP, or Health

8. Can students have their phones during after-school extracurricular activities? Yes, with the approval from the coach/sponsor.

9. Can students use wireless communication devices on school buses?

Use of wireless communication devices is generally allowed on school buses before and after school; however, it may be prohibited when noise from such devices interferes with the safe operation of the bus.

10. What happens if a student uses their device without permission?

School employees may immediately confiscate any wireless communication devices that are on, used, displayed, or visible in violation of this policy. Please refer to Policy 4318 for further information.

11. How should parents help their children follow this policy?

We encourage parents and guardians to talk with their children about the policy and the upcoming changes in state law.

Understanding expectations and reasons behind the rules will help students have a smooth and positive school experience.

Athletic Event Safety Protocol ANSON COUNTY SCHOOL DISTRICT (ACSD)

ACSD Families: We are asking for your continued support in helping us ensure that all Anson County Schools' athletic events remain safe and secure for everyone. We will be continue to strengthen our security procedures at all home athletic events across the district. These enhanced measures are part of our ongoing commitment to providing a safe environment for our students, staff, families, and community members.

ENDORSED/EFFECTIVE 06.26.23

- All spectators will be required to wear an event wristband after successfully completing security entrance procedures. This wristband must be worn at all times while on school grounds during the
- Any elementary or middle school student(s) attending a high school event should be accompanied
- by an adult 21 years of age or older. All spectators are expected to be seated during the athletic event, except for trips to the concession stands or restrooms.
- Spectators should not congregate in walkways, fence lines or near bathrooms and concession
- Law enforcement and ACSD staff will be on site to address any potential disruptions that may occur.
- Entrance procedures may include the use of walk-through or handheld metal detectors.
- Prohibited items include, but are not limited to:

 Weapons (including pocket knives), vapes, tobacco products, lighters, etc...
- There will be no re-entry to any contest after exiting the athletic facility.

The Anson County School District reserves the right to deny entry to any athletic event for any person who fails to comply with these procedures.

Bag Procedures

Fans are encouraged not to bring any type of bags inside any Anson County Schools' athletic facilities. However, the following bags are permitted:

- Bags that are clear plastic, vinyl or PVC and do not exceed 12" x 6" x 12"
- Small clutch bags, with or without a handle or strap, that do not exceed 4.5" x 6.5" (approximately the size of a hand)
- · An exception will be made for medically necessary items after proper inspection. Diaper bags are
- permitted as long as the child is in attendance. Any bag brought to the athletic event may be subject to search prior to entry into the athletic facility.
