

# Veterans Receive Classes on **Diabetes Self-Management.**

Nurse educators and pharmacy personnel from the rural health program at the W.G. (Bill) Hefner VA Medical Center in Salisbury conducted a six week class on diabetes selfmanagement at the Anson County Veterans Service Office in Wadesboro during the period of July 12th through August 16th, every Thursday. Many local veterans and their spouses or caretakers attended and were provided with lots of important information about diabetes, exercise, healthy eating and other good habits that will help them obtain and maintain their health while living with diabetes. Pharmacy personnel were also present to discuss and answer any questions about medicines and side effects to all that were present. Also present were administration personnel to enroll qualified veterans into the VA health care system on the spot. Educational handouts were provided to all that were in attendance along with Certificates of Appreciation for participating in the classes.

Some of our grocery stores back then were Gray's Market, Maner and Murray, A&P, Q&Q Grocery, Braswell's Market...and the list goes on. Now can you believe that there are no grocery stores, no clothing stores in the uptown area!!

It is also hard to believe the number of area changes in such a relatively short time, and the way business was conducted has changed.
