Anson Schools will undergo curriculum changes in the 2012 - 2013 school year. The North Carolina Department of Public Instruction's New Common Core and Essential Standards are replacing current curriculum in every grade and every course. • What are Common Core Standards? The Common Core curriculum provides states with a set of standards for English language arts, math, and literacy that create more consistency and uniformity across the nation. These standards are designed to prepare students with the knowledge and skills necessary to graduate high school prepared for college and career opportunities in a globally competitive workplace. At this time 45 states have joined together to implement these new standards.

• What are Essential Standards? North Carolina Essential Standards apply only to North Carolina. They are for the areas of science, social studies, information and technology, the arts, healthful living, world languages, and the Occupational Course of Study. Each academic subject area was developed to provide students with a more demanding curriculum to challenge all learners.



The 2012-2013 school year brings about many changes with regards to assessment. New assessments for our students, as required by the North Carolina Department of Public Instruction, are Measures of Student Learning in Science for students in grades 3, 4, 6, and 7, and Social Studies for students in grades 3 to 8.

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Also Measures of Student Learning will be required at the high school level in Environmental Science, Chemistry, English I, III, and Advanced Functions and IV Modeling, Algebra II, Civics and Economics, American History I, OCS English I, III, IV, OCS Applied Science, Physics, Physical Science, Pre-Calculus, Geometry, World History, US History, OCS Financial Management, and OCS Introductory Math

Additionally, all End of Grade tests for grades 3 to 8 in Reading Language Arts and Math along with Science in Grades 5 and 8 will be continued. At the high school level, End of Course tests in Algebra I, Biology and English II will


