How to dispose of Fat, Oil & Grease

2) Use a container with a lid.

1) Allow to cool

3) Pour the cooled grease or oil into a container 4) Place lid on container

- ✓ Place food scraps in collection containers



- ♥ Wash fryers/griddles, pots/pans and
- plates with water until oil and grease are Suse hot water to rinse grease off surfaces
