Anson County Health Department offers 2 kinds of LARC's:

• **NEXPLANON** is a matchstick size, flexible rod that implants under the skin on the upper arm. It provides 3 years of protection.

• **INTRAUTERINE (INSIDE THE UTERUS) DEVICES** are available in three different brands. Paragard for 10 years protection, Mirena for 5 years of protection, and Skyla for 3 years of protection.

Gaddy's Goose Pond

Few people are left who remember the beginning of Gaddy's Goose Pond, which later was "properly titled" Lockhart Gaddy's Wild Goose Refuge - Ansonville, N.C. Actually it was a series of happenings that made it all "work out."

The wild geese would fly south to get more food - and as they flew over the river "baited area" the hunters would shoot into the geese as they flew overhead, killing several. However, those that were crippled were caught, penned up and used for live decoys along the river area.

This type of hunting was "outlawed" as I remember growing up - I wasn't even a teenager yet. But, I remember the grownup hunters discussing this.

From this action those geese that could fly, flew in a limited area, some "landing" at a small pond that was "dug out" for Mrs. Pat Ross to fish in. (She was very feeble and limited - but enjoyed the "outing" - fish or no fish.) The geese, however, liked the temptation of the food and would "land and eat" in peace - thus the interest of the geese and watchers also. Mr. and Mrs. Gaddy began feeding the geese corn that was grown on the farm. All of this was the beginning which goes back a few years and attracted visitors from not only the United States, but other countries as well.
