# Farmers Can Vote for Feed & Fertilizer Research Tax

Farmers will have an opportunity to vote whether or not a tax put on feed and fertilizer for agricultural research will continue. A self-assessed, state-wide check-off that supports agricultural research, extension, and teaching programs in the College of Agriculture and Life Sciences (CALS) at NC State University will be held Tuesday. November 1, 2016. Users of feed and fertilizer in North Carolina will have the opportunity to vote on November 1 whether to continue the voluntary 15 cents per ton self-assessment on fertilizer and animal feed produced in our state. A 2/3 favorable vote will mean that growers are willing to continue to assess themselves to support agricultural research education. The funds, about \$1.4 million annually, are collected by the North Carolina Department of Agriculture and then allocated by the NC Carolina Agricultural Foundation, Inc.'s 148-member volunteer Board of Directors to support agricultural research and extension projects at NC State University.



# ANSON COUNTY TAX ASSESSOR Anson County 2018 Revaluation

The Anson County Tax Assessor's Office is currently conducting the 2018 Revaluation. This requires visiting every property in Anson County so that each parcel is updated to meet the mandatory requirements of NC General Statute 105-286, NC General Statute 105-283 and General Statute 105-317. These requirements state that every county in North Carolina must reappraise each parcel and come to a fair market value for taxation at least every 8 years. The revaluation will be effective January 1, 2018.

Anson County has contracted with Pearson's Appraisal Services to provide this service. You will probably see data collectors in the county collecting data and taking pictures. Their vehicles will be marked and they will be wearing name badges with their picture.
