SPCC Announces Quality Enhancement Plan

After many months of preparation, South Piedmont Community College has announced its Quality Enhancement Plan, or QEP. This plan, titled "TRAC: Teaching Responsibility, Readiness and Resourcefulness through Advising Connections," focuses on the college's efforts to improve student advising.

SPCC's QEP was developed as part of the requirements for its upcoming accreditation visit by the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools Commission on Colleges, or SACSCOC, in October. Once it gets the required approval from the SACSCOC, the QEP will be implemented over a five-year period. Surveys given to students, employees and faculty, as well as research conducted by the QEP team, led to the topic of academic advising as SPCC's area of most-needed improvement.

TRAC will focus on five key advising strategies: (1) placing an organizational emphasis on advising, (2) restructuring the advising process to create intentional partnerships, (3) integrating technology into the advising process to increase efficiency, (4) fostering a culture where "advising is teaching" through professional development, and (5) redistributing advising loads to strengthen advising connections.

The art of advising will be tackled from several angles, including pre-advising for new students through new Advising Centers and program workshops that teach students the ins and outs of their chosen program of study.

The QEP puts the focus on student learning," QEP Co-Chair and Reading Instructor Jennifer Chicosky said. "Learning how to develop an academic plan puts students on 'TRAC' to reach their educational goals."

Makena Stewart, QEP co-chair and Student Success counselor, noted that students are frequently uncertain about what is expected of them in the advising process. "Oftentimes students are not aware of their responsibilities in the advising partnership," she said. "This plan clarifies the student's role and connects them with available resources pertinent for their success.

Celebrating the Living Legacy - 75 Years

Brown Creek Soil and Water Conservation District Nation's First Soil Conservation District

On August 4, 1937, NC Secretary of State Thad Eure made history when he signed the certificate establishing the Brown Creek Soil and Water Conservation District as the first in the state, the nation and the world. The original Brown Creek Soil and Water Conservation District contained only the parts of Anson and Union Counties within the Brown Creek watershed. Included in this area, in Anson County, was the birthplace of Hugh Hammond Bennett, the father of soil and water conservation.

In 1947, the boundaries were expanded to include five counties, including Anson, Union, Stanly, Montgomery and Richmond. Over time, these other counties formed separate soil and water conservation districts. Today Anson County retains the original title, Brown Creek Soil and Water Conservation District.

Today North Carolina has 96 Soil and Water Conservation Districts covering all 100 counties in the state. These districts are serving over 85,000 school children and adults each year through their conservation education efforts. In addition, these districts are instrumental in improving the state's natural resources by providing technical assistance to landowners to help them solve their natural resource problems through voluntary, incentive based conservation programs. Their actions are improving the lives of all North Carolina citizens through implementation of programs that protect and

improve soil and water quality on both agricultural and nonagricultural lands. Submitted by Tina Rowell
