Incorporated in June of 1984, the Metrolina Theatre Association supports all levels of theatre in Charlotte-Mecklenburg and the surrounding area, including high school and college departments, community theatre organizations, professional theatres, and independent production companies.

The membership of the MTA includes theatre manage ment, artistic and auxiliary staff, actors, producers and other persons involved in creating theatre. Individuals not directly affiliated with specific organizations may also join.

From its earliest days, MTA has consistently reached out to the community with events such as the Experimental Theatre Project in 1987, the Women Playwrights Festival in 1993, High School Theatre Festival in 1995, and hosting the Southeastern Theatre Conference and the national conference for the American Association of Community Theatre (AACTFest) in 2007

The MTA for many years hosted an annual MTA Awards Gala to recognize outstanding contributions to the theatre arts. After a six-year hiatus, we have begun hosting them again.

Anson County Native Timmy Horne Makes 53-man Roster for the Atlanta Falcons Team

The Atlanta Falcons NFL football team have formally pared their roster of players down to 53. It dropped from 80 on Tuesday, August 30, when the NFL mandated roster size decreased to regular-season levels.

The team announced its initial 53-man roster, along with 27 transactions to reach that number. Included on that roster is Timmy Horne, a 2016 graduate of Anson High School.

While at Anson Schools, Timmy played football from 2012 to 2016. He recorded 22 tackles and 2.0 sacks as a junior and recorded 17 tackles, 1.5 sacks and two fumble recoveries as a sophomore. He also lettered in basketball. Anson High School Football Coach Ralph Jackson said, "I am so happy for Timmy. That's all he talked about when I first arrived as the football coach at Anson High School. He wanted to do what his other cousin Stephone Anthony did. Timmy earned a chance to play in the NFL, just like Stephone, who he looked up to dearly.

Horne is the son of Reva Horne. Horne's college stats are: Played one season (2021) at Kansas State University after spending four seasons (2017-20) at the University of Charlotte. • Notched 121 total tackles, 17 tackles for loss, 4.0 sacks, and three fumble recoveries in 55 games (30 starts) in his collegiate career. • Recorded 20 total tackles (18 solo), three tackles for loss, 2.0 sacks and one fumble recovery in 12 games for Kansas State in 2021. • Tallied 101 total tackles (44 solo), 14 tackles for loss, 2.0 sacks and two passes defensed in four seasons at Charlotte. • Earned all-Conference USA honors in 2020.

The contests are divided into adult, youth, and children's categories. The adult contests are open to anyone residing in, having resided in, attending school in, or working in Anson County; or members of the ACWC. There is a \$1 entry fee that is waived for students at any institution of higher learning. There is no entry fee for students in grades 3-12. Rules and entry forms will be provided to all Anson County schools. Home-schooled students are also invited to enter.

A complete copy of the rules and an entry form that must accompany each entry are available at the library or by writing to ACWC 2022 Contests, P.O. Box 363, Wadesboro, N.C., 28170 (enclose a self-addressed, stamped envelope). Rules and entry forms may also be printed from the ACWC website at www.ansoncountywritersclub.org. Failure to follow the rules may result in an entry being disqualified.

First, second and third place winners in the adult prose and adult poetry categories will receive \$50, \$30 and \$20, respectively. Youth winners (grades 9-12) will receive \$20, \$15 and \$10, respectively. Grades 3-5 and Grades 6-8 will compete separately in the children's division. Prizes are \$15, \$10 and \$5, respectively, for prose and poetry winners in both categories.

All winners will receive a certificate suitable for framing and will be honored at a reception for friends and family on Sunday, Feb. 26, 2023.

The ACWC held its first contests in 1989 and since published 11 anthologies of the winning entries. Anson Pathways XI is available for purchase at the Anson County Arts Council or from amazon.com. (choose "books" and then "Anson Pathways").
