Covid Update for Anson County

According to the latest information posted by the Anson County Health Department on Wednesday, September 7 Anson County was at 7,701 total Covid-19 cases, with 94 active cases. The total Covid-related deaths number remains at 99. On August 24 the cases number was 7,528, with 71 active.

If you are positive or currently awaiting test results, please stay home. If you are experiencing symptoms, please get tested. Please note that if you have taken a home test with positive results, you are not required to report it to the Health Department. However, if you would like to report it, you can call 704-694-5188 and they will take down your information and report in the state system.

A new COVID Testing site has been set up in Morven at the Church of God Prophecy (8447 US Hwy 52 South). Currently they are only administering PCR tests and are open Monday-Friday (9am-4pm).

You can still stop by the health department and pick up test kits to keep at home. If you aren't feeling well you can send someone and they will send some to you.

The Health Department still offers Moderna vaccine on Thursdays (Walk-In). They hope to be offering the new (Fall) Bivalent Booster Vaccines within the next few weeks. They will make an announcement when those are received and available.

Anson County 4-H Livestock Draws a Crowd!

On Saturday, August 27 the Anson County Cattlemen's Association partnered with Anson County 4-H to host the 2022 4-H Farm Credit Show Circuit. The annual 4-H Farm Credit Showmanship Circuit, sponsored by Carolina Farm Credit and Cape Fear Farm Credit, provides youth ages 5 to 19 an opportunity to compete against other youth from across the region. The Showmanship classes are designed to gauge the 4-H'ers knowledge and skill with the animal. By participating in the 4-H Farm Credit Showmanship Circuit, youth learn leadership skills, record-keeping, communication and responsibility, while increasing their self-esteem.

The Anson Heifer Show was hosted in Ansonville and included 24 youth from Anson and seven surrounding counties. These youth brought with them more than 30 beef heifers to compete in the showmanship and breed classes.

Anson County participants in the Peewee Showmanship Class (non-competitive) were Clark Hayes, Nate Hatley, and Sadie Sikes. Anson County participant in the Cloverbud Showmanship Class (non-competitive) was Addie Sikes. Anson County Junior Showmanship Class participants were EB Carpenter (1st), Mason Mills (3rd), and Colton Garner (4th). In the Intermediate Showmanship, representing Anson County, Maddie Carpenter placed 1st. Anson County participants in the Senior Showmanship Class were Lynlee Martin (3rd), Clinton Mills (7th), and Abigail Underwood (8th). EB Carpenter of Anson County was also the Reserve Champion for the English Breed. Lydia Hill of Union County was the Supreme Champion and she won a weaver leather 5' showbox, galvanized steel, two doors, dolly donated by Southern States-Monroe. There are six more shows remaining in the circuit and once the circuit concludes, heifers participating in the showmanship circuit will be eliqible to show at the State Fair.
