## Anson Varsity Football Triumphs Over Albemarle High School in Gold Star Football Game

In a matchup of Highway 52 rivals on Friday, September 13, Anson High School defeated Albemarle High School 41-0 in the Gold Star Football Game, an event dedicated to honoring and remembering local military heroes who have served and sacrificed. The presence of local military veterans and their families was a reminder of the community's appreciation and respect for their service.

**Offensive Highlights** Anson's passing attack was led by junior quarterback Dock Hyatt, who completed 11 of 16 passes for 153 yards and one touchdown, showcasing his accuracy and playmaking ability. Senior Jayden Little was a key target, accumulating 63 yards and one touchdown from 5 receptions, averaging 12.5 yards per catch.

In the rushing department, Anson's offensive line continuously opened holes for senior Jazeer Griffin. Griffin had a standout performance with 182 yards and 3 touchdowns. Senior Kendrick Maye added 60 rushing yards and 2 touchdowns, while junior Dallas Lilly contributed 24 rushing yards.

**Defensive and Special Teams Standouts** Anson's defense and special teams played a crucial role, effectively neutralizing Albemarle's offensive threats and capitalizing on key moments. Key players for most tackles was T'landis Carr (6 total tackles), Dequan McKeever (5 total tackles), Gabriel Maxwell and Aidan Purser, both with 5 total tackles each. Jayden Little, Markeys Peguese and Jackson Stinson all had 3 total tackles each. Gabriel Maxwell, T'landis Carr and Daron Harrington also contributed to several sacks, including a safety, which helped lead the Bearcats to their first shutout of the 2024 season.

Anson High School's victory in the Gold Star Football Game not only showcased the athletic ability of the team, but also highlighted a commitment to honoring local heroes. With strong performances on both sides of the ball, Anson continues to be a force this season.

The Lady Cats had a few runners out for various reasons that kept us from scoring as a team. The three who ran all improved on their times from our first meet.

- Ari Metcalf broke 30:00 minutes for the first time this year by dropping her 1st meet time of 30:54 to 29:12.
  - Lorelei Woodall went from a 31:46 to 30:13.
  - Diamond Morman improved her time by almost ten minutes by running a 41:11.5k. In the first meet, her time was 50:50.
- We had five boys running in the meet, making it the first time the boys have been able to score as a team in well over a decade.
- Mason Gaddy led the way with a 22:30 performance.
  - Gaddy was followed by Walter Marsh (24:20), Cameron Eddins (30:50), Elijah Sellers (35:14), and Maalik Cooper (35:36).

The boys placed 4th in the four-team meet, which Parkwood won with 23 points. CATA was second with 47, followed by West Stanly's 77. We finished with 111 points.
