As North Carolina's land use becomes more urban, the need for stormwater and water quality protection increases. Thanks to a new state program, funds are stormwater practices such as backyard rain gardens, backyard wetlands, water harvest cisterns, streambank protection, and critical area planting. These practices help slow and filter stormwater, conserve water use, and pre-

vent soil erosion.

holds, schools, businesses, local government, churches, communities, parks, essentially all publically and privately owned lands, are eligible. The state funded program, called Community Conservation Assistance Program (CCAP), addresses stormwater pollution, flooding, soil erosion, and poor drainage issues to help protect property, beautify, and provide essential wildlife habitat. CCAP is administered through the Brown Creek Soil and Water Conservation District in Wadesboro. Fiscal year 2012 funds are limited so please apply early.

Anyone interested in learning more about CCAP is invited to attend informational session, Thursday, October 4 at 6 p.m. at the Anson Cooperative Extension Service. There we will cover eligibility, application process, and approved practices.
