

#### **Anson Board of Health Adopts New Policy for Pets Exposed to Rabies**

At the meeting of the Anson County Board of Health on September 13 the board adopted the 2016 model rule for the post rabies exposure management of dogs and cats that is recommended by the North Carolina Division of Public Health.

Copies of the rule are available at the Anson County Health Department. The new control measures will result in fewer dogs and cats euthanized, shorter quarantine periods (four months rather than six months) and allow for more 45 day owner (at home) observations for lapsed animals with appropriate documentation.

This model rule implements and particularizes the authority given to the local health director in G.S. 130A-197 to effectively and efficiently protect the public's health utilizing the most current science. Accordingly, the Anson County Board of Health adopted the recommendations and guidelines for rabies post exposure management of dogs and cats specified by the National Association of State Public Health Veterinarians in the 2016 edition of the Compendium of Animal Rabies Prevention and Control (Part 1. Rabies Prevention and Control B. Prevention and control methods in domestic and confined animals. 5 Postexposure Management). These provisions of the Compendium shall be required control measures in the County of Anson pursuant to G.S. 130A-197, effective November 1, 2016.
