Wadesboro Police Department Made Multiple Arrests Last Week

Among those arrested was a 16 year old student who took a weapon and drugs to school

The Wadesboro Police Department made several weapons and drug charges

September 7 through September 16. On Monday, September 7 at approximately 11:25 p.m. a Wadesboro Police Officer conducted a traffic stop near highway 52 South that resulted in the arrest of Matthew Lamonte Tillman, 23, of Wadesboro. Tillman was charged with Felony Possession of Cocaine, and Driving While License Revoked. He was placed in Anson county Jail under a \$5,000 secured bond.

 On Saturday, September 12 at approximately 11:39 p.m. a Wadesboro Police Officer conducted a traffic stop on Cloud Avenue at Old Lilesville Road that resulted in the arrest of Scotty Jayhugh Hammond, 21, of Wadesboro. Hammond were charged with Felony Possession ingwith Intent to Sale and Distribute Marijuana, Felony Maintaining Vehicle/Dwell/Place CS, Possession of Marijuana Paraphernalia, and Possession of Marijuana >1/2 oz. to 1 1/2 oz. He was placed in Anson County Jail under a \$5000 secured bond.

 On Saturday, September 12 at approximately 1:31 a.m. Officers from the Wadesboro Police Department, Anson County Sheriff's Office, and the NC highway Patrol were conducting a drivers license checkpoint at the intersection of Highway 52 South and Old Lilesvile Road. Reginald O'Brian Kirby, 31, of Lilesville was arrested and charged with Felony Possession of a Firearm by a Felon, and Carrying a Concealed Weapon. He was placed in Anson County Jail under a \$2000 secured bond. On Sunday, September 13 at approximately 12:56 a.m. Wadesboro Police Officers conducted a traffic stop on West Caswell Street which resulted in the arrest of the driver and passenger for numerous drug and gun related charges. The driver, Ken William Gaddy II, 24, of Wadesboro was arrested and charged with Felony Possession with Intent to Sale and Distribute Marijuana, Felony Possession of Marijuana 2.05 oz., Carrying a Concealed Weapon, and Possession Marijuana Paraphernalia. He was placed in Anson county Jail under a \$7000 secured bond.

Officers also arrested the passenger, Deavonte Sidale White, 22, of Marshville. White was charged with Felony Possession with Intent to Sale and Distribute Marijuana, Felony Possession of Marijuana 2.05 oz., Carrying Antwon Delon a Concealed Weapon, and Possession Marijuana Paraphernalia. He was Funderburk placed in Anson county Jail under a \$7000 secured bond.On Monday, September 14 at approximately 12:50 a.m. a Wadesboro Police Officer was conducting patrol in the 200 block of Lakeview Drive when he observed a subject walking in the yard of a resident. Because of the time of night and it being a residential area, the officer made contact with the subject. After the encounter with the subject the officer knew this wasn't his residence, which lead up to the officer seizing a hand gun. Gavin Lee Rummage 31, of Wadesboro was arrested charged with Felony Possession of a Firearm by a Felon, and Carrying a Concealed Weapon. He was placed in Anson County Jail under a \$2500 secured bond. On Monday, September 14 an Anson County School Principal and Wadesboro Police Department School Resource Officer received information in reference to a weapon on campus. The SRO Officer and school personnel took the necessary safety precautions, and located the student and the weapon. Antwon Delon Funderburk, 16, of Lilesville was arrested and charged with Felony Weapon on Educational Property, and Possession of Drug Paraphernalia. He was placed in Anson County Jail under a \$101,000 secured bond.

The Anson County Writers' Club (ACWC) is pleased to announce its Twenty-Sixth Contest in Prose and Poetry. The ACWC will award over \$400 in prize money to the winners of the annual writing contests.

First, second and third place winners in the adult prose and adult poetry categories will receive 50, 30 and 20, respectively. Youth winners (grades 10-12) will receive 20,\$15 and \$10, respectively. Grades 3-6 and Grades 7-9 will compete separately in the children's division. Prizes are \$15, \$10 and \$5, respectively, for prose and poetry winners in both categories.

There is no entry fee for students. Entries will be accepted from students living in or attending school in Anson County. Rules and entry forms will be provided to all schools.

The deadline for the 2015 contests is 5:30 p.m. on Monday, December 7.

A complete copy of the rules and an entry form that must accompany each entry are available at the H.B. Allen Library; the Anson County Chamber of Commerce; or by writing to ACWC 2015 Contests, P.O. Box 363, Wadesboro, N.C., 28170 (enclose a self-addressed, stamped envelope).

The contest committee urges writers to study the contest rules carefully. In past years, some excellent entries that might have won were disqualified because the writers did not follow instructions.
