Operation Medicine Drop is Saturday

The Anson County Sheriff's Office in partnership with the Wadesboro Police Depart-ment and Anson County Safe Kids will hold its ninth "Operation Medicine Drop" this Saturday, September 27th, from 10 a.m. to 1 p.m. at the Anson Station Shopping Center, next to Food Lion. The purpose of this program is to encourage individuals to turn in their old medicines that are no longer needed or out of date and provide a safe and secure method for disposing of them.

The Sheriff's Office conducts an Operation Medicine Drop twice each year. Over the past five years over 100,000 doses of pills, morphine patches, opiate based medicines, syringes, needles, as well as liquid medicines and inhalers have been turned in.

Anson County Sheriff Tommy Allen said that this is an easy and safe way for citizens to properly dispose of old, out-of-date or no longer needed medicines. "What we are doing is giving our citizens a chance to clean out their medicine cabinets. Bring the old medicines in, no questions asked and we will see that it is properly disposed of. Please bring your medications in their original containers so we can verify exactly what they are," Sheriff Allen said.

Health officials say flushing or putting medicines in trash ends up in ground water or landfills. Neither are acceptable ways to dispose of unused medications.

Annual overdose deaths from prescription medicines have now surpassed that of all illegal drugs combined.
