

N.C. Turnpike Authority Pilots In-Vehicle Toll Payment with Volvo and Mastercard

North Carolina drivers may soon pay their tolls the same way they order a drive-thru milkshake—without ever taking their hands off the wheel. The N.C. Turnpike Authority (NCTA), teaming up with Volvo Car USA and Mastercard, has announced a new pilot program that lets drivers pay tolls directly through their car's infotainment system. No transponders, no fumbling for change, and no awkward glovebox digging for that one lost EZ Pass—just tap, confirm, and cruise.

Unveiled September 4 at the N.C. Transportation Summit, the program is expected to launch in late 2025 with up to 100 Volvo drivers testing the system. "This technology represents a significant step forward in making travel more convenient and seamless for drivers," said J.J. Eden, NCTA's Executive Director. Translation: no more excuses for skipping tolls because you "forgot cash."

The system works by linking a car's vehicle identification number and license plate data to a secure payment token. Mastercard handles the payment in real time, while Volvo's Google built-in intotainment system makes it all look slick. The plattorm could one day stretch beyond toll booths to cover parking, fueling, and even car washes - meaning your car might pay for its own bubble bath before you can say "full-service wax."

Future phases may add Vehicle-to-Everything (V2X) technology, letting cars chat with infrastructure, networks, and even pedestrians. (Imagine your Volvo politely reminding a distracted jogger: "Excuse me, crosswalk in use.")

For now, only 100 Volvo drivers will get to brag about their car's new side hustle as a toll-paying assistant. But NCTA hints that if all goes well, the system could eventually roll out to more makes and models, possibly turning the dreaded toll booth into nothing more than a background memory—like cassette players and roll-down windows.
