Annual Meeting Of Members



Commissioner Causey urges Medicare beneficiaries to check their options for 2026

RALEIGH — Insurance Commissioner Mike Causey reminds Medicare beneficiaries that it's time to compare and evaluate their current plans and make necessary changes during the annual Open Enrollment Period. "What worked for you this year may not be the best plan for you in 2026," Commissioner Causey said. "It is

important to take advantage of the Open Enrollment Period by contacting local Seniors' Health Insurance Information Program (SHIIP) counselors to save money, improve your coverage or both." The Open Enrollment Period begins on Oct. 15 and runs for eight weeks to give you enough time to review

and make changes to your Medicare coverage. Changes must be made by Dec. 7 to guarantee your coverage will begin without interruption on Jan. 1, 2026.

It is important to contact your local SHIIP counselor before deciding about coverage for 2026. This may help you receive a more affordable and better Medicare health and/or drug plan in your area. For example, even if you are satisfied with your current Medicare Advantage or Part D plan, there may be another plan in your area

that covers your health care and/or drugs at a better price. SHIIP is a division of the North Carolina Department of Insurance and offers free, unbiased information about Medicare, Medicare prescription drug coverage, Medicare Advantage, long-term care insurance and other health insurance issues. SHIIP counselors can also help people find out if they are eligible for Medicare cost savings programs.

Here are some of the ways to review and compare plans available for 2026:
