## **Teen Drivers Get New Option for Road Tests**

Good news, bad news, parents. The good news: your teen now has more options to take their dreaded road test. The bad news: that means they might be behind the wheel

The N.C. Division of Motor Vehicles (NCDMV) has started certifying private driver education schools to administer road tests for teens seeking their Level 2 Limited Provisional License. Translation: instead of spending an entire afternoon in line at the DMV, you can now spend an entire afternoon chewing your nails while your teen parallel parks in front of a stranger.

The plan is simple—let private schools handle the test, then send the successful (and hopefully careful) drivers to the DMV just to complete the paperwork. Wait times at license offices should shrink, efficiency should rise, and parents should probably stock

The cost of these new school-based road tests? That's up to each school. So whether you pay in cash, card, or gray hairs, be prepared for a little sticker shock.

"By outsourcing some road tests to certified private driver education schools, we're providing more options for teens and their families while increasing efficiency at our driver license offices," said NCDMV Commissioner Paul Tine. In plain English: fewer cranky parents in line, fewer overwhelmed examiners, and more time for everyone to pretend they enjoy the DMV experience.

Schools are being certified through training sessions and will soon be listed on the NCDMV website. And that's not all: thanks to Senate Bill 245, teens will soon be able to upgrade from a Level 2 to a Level 3 license online. Because nothing says "peace of mind" like giving your teenager more driving privileges with the click of a button.

So buckle up, North Carolina. The roads may soon be filled with fresh drivers who've skipped the DMV line but not the teen confidence that comes with saying, "Relax, Mom, I've got this." More information at ncdot.gov drivers license.

are reminded to include their level of play when registering — no one wants to accidentally challenge a seasoned pro when they only just learned the difference between a dink and a drive. "Every registration to this event brings us closer to achieving our mission of
