The Anson County Farmers Market Association is extending the Saturday market through early December. Market Manager Leslie Lee explained their reasoning, "We took a survey, and both customers and merchants were interested in having a place to meet. It's exciting to know that so many Anson County residents want to continue to support local farmers, bakers and artisans."

The fall and winter market, called "Seasons' Eatings, will continue at its existing location at 1736 US Highway 52 South in Wadesboro. Hours of operation will be 9:00 a.m. to 12 noon on the 2nd and 4th Saturdays of the month, through December 9.

Special events will include a Craft Fair on November 11 and Small Business Saturday on November 26.

Medicare Beneficiaries Should Review Their Options for 2024

NC Insurance Commissioner Mike Causey reminds Medicare beneficiaries to compare and evaluate their current plans and make necessary changes during the annual Ôpen Enrollment Period.

"Medicare plans and prices change," Commissioner Causey said. "It is important for Medicare beneficiaries to take advantage of the Open Enrollment Period by contacting local Seniors' Health Insurance Information Program (SHIIP) counselors to save money, improve your coverage or both."

The Open Enrollment Period begins on October 15 and runs for eight weeks to give you enough time to review and make changes to your Medicare coverage. Changes must be made by December 7 to guarantee your coverage will begin without interruption on January 1, 2024.

It is important to contact your local SHIIP counselor before deciding about coverage because you may be able to receive more affordable and better Medicare health and/or drug plan options in your area. For example, even if you are satisfied with your current Medicare Advantage or Part D plan, there may be another plan in your area that covers your health care and/or drugs at a better price

In Anson County, Grace Senior Center is our local SHIIP office. You can contact them at 704-694-6616.

SHIIP is a division of the North Carolina Department of Insurance and offers free, unbiased information about Medicare, Medicare prescription drug coverage, Medicare Advantage, long-term care insurance and other health insurance issues. SHIIP counselors can also help people find out if they are eligible for Medicare cost savings programs.

Here are some of the ways to review and compare plans available for 2024.

• Get one-on-one help from your local SHIIP office.

• Get one-on-one help from SHIIP by calling 1-855-408-1212, Monday through Friday, from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m.

 Visit www.medicare.gov/find-a-plan to compare your current coverage with all the options that are available in your area and enroll in a new plan if you decide to make a change

 Review the Medicare & You handbook. It was mailed to people with Medicare in September.

 Call 1-800-MEDICARE (1-800-633-4227) 24-hours a day, seven days a week, to find out more about your coverage options. TTY users should call 1-877-486-2048. Contact your trusted licensed insurance agent.

Multistate Operation Results in Arrest of Tony Anthony Deese, Jr.

Law enforcement officers from the Wadesboro Police Department, Lancaster County Sheriff's Office of Lancaster County, SC, Anson County Sheriff's Office, and the North Carolina State Bureau of Investigation, executed a search warrant the morning of Friday, September 29 at a residence on Camden Road in Wadesboro, with technical assistance provided by the Union County Sheriff's Office.

This warrant comes after a joint investigation between the Wadesboro Police Department, the Lancaster County Sheriff's Office, and the Lancaster County Multijurisdictional Violent Crime Taskforce. Numerous illegal items were located and seized during the search and as a result Tony Anthony Deese, Jr., 30, of Wadesboro was arrested and charged with the following offenses: Possession of a Weapon of Mass Destruction; Possession of a Firearm by Convicted Felon; 2 counts - Possession of a Stolen Firearm; Possession with intent to sell and/or deliver cocaine; Possession with intent to sell and/or manufacture and/or deliver methamphetamine; Possession with intent to sell and/or manufacture and/or deliver MDMA; Felony possession
