1941 Studebaker Champion

My first new car had a "birthday" recently – sixty-five years ago (April 4, 1941). This was just after World War II and cars were plentiful – the only thing was, money to buy them was scarce!

I bought this Studebaker from Henry Spears, a cousin who sold cars - both new and used. In fact, it was about this time that he purchased the Governor Cameron Morrison Rolls Royce for about \$400 at the car sale. That Rolls was some car! Under the hood many things were chrome, such as the valve cover, etc. I don't remember who Henry sold it to, but with only about four to six miles per gallon – and even at gas prices of 20¢ per gallon – it was "pure luxury" to operate that car!!

The above picture was sometime later - in the summer of 1945. Standing in front of the Studebaker was my wife Lucy, holding our son Tommy, who was then about one year old. Now we are all "just a little older," have "traveled many miles" and are thankful to be here!!
